9	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State
10	to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 8C of Article X of the Constitution of the State of
11	Oklahoma; eliminating income threshold; providing for occupancy requirement; providing exception;
12	restricting fair cash value of homestead for purposes of eligibility; prescribing definition of fair cash
13	value pursuant to Section 8B of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; providing ballot title; and
14	directing filing.
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17	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
18	2ND SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
19	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
20	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
21	the following proposed amendment to Section 8C of Article X of the
22	Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to read as follows:
23	Section 8C. A. Despite any provision to the contrary,
24	beginning January 1, $\frac{2005}{2025}$ , the fair cash value, as determined

1 by law, on each homestead of an individual head of household whose 2 gross household income from all sources for the preceding calendar vear did not exceed an amount as provided in subsection B of this 3 4 section, and which individual head of household who is sixty-five 5 (65) years of age or older who has occupied the property for a 6 period of at least ten (10) years prior to the first January 1 date 7 following the year during which the person attains the age of sixtyfive (65) years, shall not exceed the fair cash value placed upon 8 9 the property during the first year in which the individual head of 10 household was sixty-five (65) years of age or older and had gross household income from all sources which did not exceed an amount as 11 12 provided in subsection B of this section. For purposes of this 13 section, absence from the homestead for a period not to exceed three 14 hundred sixty-five (365) days during any ten-year period shall not 15 disqualify the owner from eligibility. The provisions of this 16 section shall only be applicable to a homestead with a fair cash 17 value of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) or less. For 18 purposes of this section, the fair cash value shall be determined in 19 the same manner as provided by Section 8B of Article X of the 20 Oklahoma Constitution. Subject to the limitations of this section, 21 the fair cash value shall not exceed such amount as long as the 22 individual head of household who is sixty-five (65) years of age or 23 older owns and occupies the property and as long as the gross 24 household income from all sources does not exceed an amount as

1 provided in subsection B of this section. If any improvements are 2 made to the property, the fair cash value of the improvements shall be assessed in accordance with law by the county assessor and added 3 to the assessed value of the property. Once the fair cash value of 4 5 the improvements has been added to the fair cash value of the property, the total fair cash value shall not exceed the revised 6 7 valuation of the property so long as the individual head of household who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older owns and 8 9 occupies the property and so long as the gross household income from 10 all sources does not exceed an amount as provided in subsection B of 11 this section. For any individual head of household who is sixty-12 five (65) years of age or older prior to January 1, 1997, and has 13 gross household income from all sources of Twenty-five Thousand 14 Dollars (\$25,000.00) or less in calendar year 1996, the fair cash 15 value of the real property shall be the fair cash value placed upon 16 the property on January 1, 1997. If the individual head of 17 household ceases to own and occupy the property or if the gross 18 household income from all sources exceeds an amount as provided in 19 subsection B of this section, the fair cash value of the property 20 shall be determined as if the provisions of Section 8 of Article X 21 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma or any other provisions 22 relating to a limitation on the fair cash value of locally assessed 23 real property had been in effect during the time the property was 24 valued pursuant to the provisions of this section.

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1	B. The income threshold for the gross household income from all
2 +	sources for an individual head of household under this section shall
3 +	not exceed the amount determined by the United States Department of
4 -	Housing and Urban Development to be the estimated median income for
5 =	the preceding year for the county or metropolitan statistical area
6 4	which includes such county. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall
7 1	provide such information to each county assessor each year as soon
8 .	as such information becomes available.
9	SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional
10 a	amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in
11	the following form:

13 1	Legislative Referendum No State Question No
14	THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:
15	This measure amends Section 8C of the Oklahoma Constitution.
16	Increases in fair cash value of homesteads are limited for
17	individual heads of household age sixty-five (65) or older. The
18	increase cannot exceed the fair cash value of the property
19	during the first year in which the owner was age sixty-five (65)
20	years of age or older. This limit applies if the individual
21	head of household meets both the age requirement and an income
22	limit determined by the United States Department of Housing and
23	Urban Development. This measure would eliminate the income
24	limit requirement. The age limit would not change. The person

1	would be required to have occupied the homestead for ten (10)
2	years. A person could be away from the homestead for a period
3	not to exceed three hundred sixty-five (365) days in a ten-year
4	period and still qualify. The limit on increases in fair cash
5	value of homestead property would only apply if the fair cash
6	value of the homestead is Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
7	(\$500,000.00) or less. This value would be determined the same
8	way as it is determined for all other purposes in the property
9	tax system.
10	SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED?

13	SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives,
14	immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and
15	file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in
16	SECTION 2 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the
17	Attorney General.
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
