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10	SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION
11	An Act relating to law enforcement canines; creating the Canine Cooperative Grant Program; allowing
12	legislative appropriations, private donations, and federal grants; allowing certain expenditures by the
13	Department of Environmental Quality; providing for promulgation of rules; providing purpose; allowing
14	certain fund retention; providing annual grant limits; permitting certain medical reimbursements for
15	canines injured in the line of service; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-122.4 of Title 47, unless
21	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
22	A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
23	fund for the Department of Environmental Quality to be designated
24	the "Canine Cooperative Grant Program". The fund shall be a

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continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
consist of all monies received from legislative appropriations,

private donations, and federal grant programs. All monies accruing
to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be

budgeted and expended by the Department of Environmental Quality for
the administration of the Canine Cooperative Grant Program.

- B. The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality is hereby directed to promulgate rules to create the Canine Cooperative Grant Program to provide financial assistance for state, county, and municipal law enforcement entities and fire departments for acquisition and training of law enforcement canines, search, rescue, and recovery canines, and medical expenses related to injuries sustained while in the line of service; provided, canines shall be trained in accordance with state law and agency standards and shall be specifically allocated for law enforcement officers and fire departments.
- C. The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall be authorized to retain five percent (5%) of the proceeds of the fund, annually, to be used for administering the program.
- D. Subject to availability of funds, the program shall have the following annual limits for grants:
- 1. Grants not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per county sheriff for canine purchases or canine training;

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        2. Grants not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars ($10,000.00) per
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    municipal police department for canine purchases or canine training;
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    and
        3. Grants not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars ($10,000.00) per
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    fire department for canine purchases or canine training.
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            Subject to the availability of funds, the program shall also
    make grants for the reimbursement of medical expenses for canines
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    injured in the line of service with a fire department or state,

        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
