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6	An Act relating to higher education; creating the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act; providing short
7	title; defining terms; creating the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program; providing purpose of
8	program; providing for award amount; providing eligibility criteria for program; providing retention
9	eligibility criteria for program; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for calculation of
10	scholarship program award to be allocated from
11	certain fund; directing benefits to be awarded to certain eligible applicants subject to availability
12	of funding and the number of eligible applicants; directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
13	Education to make awards on certain basis if certain funds are insufficient; allowing the State Regents to
14	take into consideration certain grants and scholarships; prohibiting award from being allowed
15	for certain courses or units taken after certain period of time; allowing award for certain courses or
16	units taken after certain period of time under certain circumstances; allowing the State Regents to
17	set aside certain funds for certain full commitment; directing priority to be given to certain continued
18	support; providing for calculation of financial need; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3953.1, which relates
19	to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund; updating statutory language; expanding use of fund
20	for certain purpose; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an
21	emergency.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2500 of Title 70, unless there 2 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 3 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma 4 Α. 5 Access and Achievement Act". B. As used in this act: 6 "CTP program" means a degree, certificate, or nondegree 7 1. program that meets each of the following criteria: 8 9 a. is offered by an institution of higher education or technology center school, 10 is delivered to students physically attending the 11 b. 12 institution of higher education or technology center school, 13 is designed to support students with intellectual с. 14 disabilities who are seeking to continue academic, 15 career and technical, and independent living 16 instruction at an institution of higher education or 17 technology center school to prepare for gainful 18 employment, 19 d. includes an advising and curriculum structure, 20 requires students with intellectual disabilities to 21 e. participate on not less than a half-time basis as 22 determined by the institution of higher education or 23 technology center school, with such participation 24

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1 focusing on academic components and occurring through one or more of the following activities: 2 regular enrollment in credit-bearing courses with 3 (1)nondisabled students offered by the institution 4 5 of higher education or technology center school, auditing or participating in courses with 6 (2) nondisabled students offered by the institution 7 for higher education or technology center school 8 9 for which the student does not receive regular academic credit, 10 enrollment in noncredit-bearing, nondegree 11 (3) courses with nondisabled students, or 12 13 (4) participation in internships or work-based training in settings with nondisabled students, 14 f. requires students with intellectual disabilities to be 15 socially and academically integrated with nondisabled 16 students to the maximum extent possible, and 17 is approved by the United States Department of 18 g. Education pursuant to P.L. No. 110-315, the Higher 19 Education Opportunity Act, as amended; 20 "Eligible student" means a student with an intellectual 2. 21 disability who is eligible for the scholarship program; 22 3. "Scholarship program" means the Oklahoma Access and 23 Achievement Program; 24

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4. "State educational institution" means a higher education
 institution or technology center school supported wholly or in part
 by direct legislative appropriations that provides a CTP program;
 5. "State Regents" means the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
 Education; and

6. "Student with an intellectual disability" means a student: 6 with a cognitive impairment, characterized by 7 a. significant limitations in intellectual and cognitive 8 9 functioning and adaptive behavior as expressed in conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills, and 10 who is currently or was formerly eligible for a free 11 b. appropriate public education under the Individuals 12 with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), including a 13 student who was determined eligible for special 14 education or related services under IDEA but attended 15 a private school or was educated pursuant to the other 16 means of education exception provided for in 17 subsection A of Section 10-105 of Title 70 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes. 19

C. There is hereby created a program to be known as the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program. The purpose of the program is to provide an award to eligible students with intellectual disabilities who are pursuing studies in this state at a CTP program. The award shall be an amount equal to the nonguaranteed

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resident tuition at an institution of higher education or the
 tuition at a technology center school.

D. A student with an intellectual disability shall be eligible
for the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program if the student:
I. Is a resident of this state or enrolled in a school district

6 located in this state that serves students who reside in both this 7 state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract authorized by 8 Section 5-117.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 2. Is a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United 10 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully 11 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in 12 the scholarship program and qualify for an award;

13 3. Has graduated within the previous six (6) years from a 14 public high school accredited by the State Board of Education or a 15 private school, or has satisfactorily completed within the previous 16 six (6) years an educational program that was provided through a 17 means other than a public or private school;

Has secured admission to and enrolled in a CTP program at an
 educational institution that meets the requirements to be eligible
 for federal student financial aid; and

5. Has established financial need according to the provisions
of Section 3 of this act and standards and provisions promulgated by
the State Regents.

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E. To retain eligibility in the scholarship program, a student with an intellectual disability shall:

3 1. Meet the requirements for retention and completion as 4 established by the state educational institution where the student 5 is enrolled;

6 2. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required by the7 CTP program criteria;

8 3. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of9 eligibility as promulgated by the State Regents; and

Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
 of more than one semester from a state educational institution. A
 student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
 permanently lose eligibility for scholarship program benefits.

14 F. The State Regents shall promulgate rules relating to the 15 establishment and maintenance of eligibility under the scholarship 16 program.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2501 of Title 70, unless there 19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent to the nonguaranteed resident tuition at an institution of higher education or the tuition at a technology center school for which an eligible student is obligated at a CTP program shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund

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created pursuant to Section 3953.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes.

Benefits awarded through the scholarship program shall be 3 в. awarded to all eligible student applicants without any limitation on 4 5 the number of awards in any year other than the amount of funds available for the scholarship program and the number of eligible 6 student applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection C of 7 this section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all 8 9 eligible student applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the 10 State Regents may take into consideration other grants and 11 12 scholarships received by an eligible student applicant when making 13 awards.

C. An award provided for by this section shall not be allowed 14 for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than five (5) 15 years after the eligible student's first semester of postsecondary 16 enrollment. The State Regents may award the scholarship program 17 benefits for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than 18 five (5) years after the eligible student's first semester of 19 postsecondary enrollment only in hardship circumstances; provided, 20 however, no eligible student may receive benefits beyond a 21 cumulative time period of five (5) years. 22

D. The State Regents may, at the time an award is made onbehalf of an eligible student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher

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1 Learning Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to the 2 student. For all academic years, students who have previously received awards under the provisions of the Oklahoma Access and 3 Achievement Act and who have continued at all times to fulfill the 4 5 requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to the scholarship program shall be given an absolute priority for 6 continued financial support by the scholarship program above any 7 students who are applying for an award for the first time. 8

9 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2502 of Title 70, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 Α. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection B of this section, a student with an intellectual disability shall not be 13 found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access 14 and Achievement Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program 15 award for any year during which the student is enrolled in a CTP 16 program at a state educational institution, the federal adjusted 17 gross income of the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) exceeds 18 One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per year. 19 The determination of financial qualification provided in this subsection 20 shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the 21 parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if a student is determined to be 22 independent of his or her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) for federal 23 financial aid purposes. 24

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1 B. 1. A student with an intellectual disability who was 2 adopted between birth and twelve (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-3 ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 4 5 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in 6 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access and Achievement 7 Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year 8 9 during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the 10 student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 11 12 (\$150,000.00) per year.

2. A student with an intellectual disability who was adopted 13 between thirteen (13) and seventeen (17) years of age while in the 14 permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-15 ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 16 17 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in 18 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access and Achievement 19 Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year 20 during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state 21 educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the 22 student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 23 (\$200,000.00) per year. 24

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3. The determination of financial qualification provided for in this subsection shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the student's parent(s), if the student is determined to be independent of the student's parent(s) for federal financial aid purposes.

6 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3953.1, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 Section 3953.1. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be 9 known as the "Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund". The 10 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be the trustees of 11 said the Trust Fund.

B. The State Regents shall utilize said the Trust Fund to implement the provisions of Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and Sections 1 through 3 of this act.

С. The Trust Fund principal shall consist of monies the 15 Legislature appropriates or transfers to the Oklahoma State Regents 16 17 for Higher Education for the Trust Fund and any monies or assets contributed to the Trust Fund from any other source, public or 18 private. All monies accruing to the credit of said the fund are 19 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State 20 Regents. Expenditures from said the fund shall be made upon 21 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 22 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 23 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 24

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1 D. Notwithstanding other provisions of law, income and 2 investment return on Trust Fund principal shall accrue to the Trust Fund for use as provided by authorization of the trustees for the 3 purposes provided in Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and 4 5 Sections 1 through 3 of this act. The State Regents may also utilize the Trust Fund principal for the purposes provided in 6 Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and Sections 1 through 3 of 7 this act. Except as otherwise provided by law, no such income or 8 9 investment return or principal shall be used for administrative 10 expenses; expenses incurred by the State Regents in the administration of the Trust Fund and of the Oklahoma Higher Learning 11 12 Access Program established by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act and the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program established by 13 the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act shall be paid from monies 14 appropriated to the State Regents coordinating board for their 15 general operating budget. 16

Ε. The State Regents shall adopt rules for accomplishing 17 transfer of funds from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust 18 Fund to the appropriate institutional Educational and General 19 Operations Revolving Funds, as provided in Section 3901 of this 20 title, to private institutions, and to the appropriate technology 21 center school district to cover general enrollment fees or tuition 22 for eligible students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning 23 Access Act and the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act. Allocations 24

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1	from the Trust Fund may be made only for the purpose of covering the
2	general enrollment fees or tuition of eligible students. No portion
3	of the Trust Fund may be used or allocated for administrative or
4	operating expenses of any higher education institution or technology
5	center school.
6	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
7	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
