AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 17-116.10, is amended to read as follows: 13 Section 17-116.10. A. Subject to the requirements of Section 14 6-101.2 of this title and any other applicable requirements of law, 15 a member of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma may enter 16 into postretirement employment with a public school of Oklahoma and 17 still receive monthly retirement benefits subject to the following 18 limitations: 19 1. A retired member is not eligible to be employed by the 20 public schools of Oklahoma, in any capacity, for sixty (60) calendar 21 days between the retiree's last day of preretirement public 22 education employment and any postretirement public education 23

employment. For purposes of this section, the term "last day of

- 1 preretirement employment" shall mean the last day the employee is required to be physically present on the job to complete the terms 2 of the employment contract or agreement. An employee on paid leave 3 is still considered to be employed for purposes of this section. 4 5 Employment under any conditions during this time, volunteer services for the purpose of obtaining a paid position at a later date, or 6 payment at a later time for services performed during this time 7 period shall cause the forfeiture of all retirement benefits 8 9 received during the period;
- 2. Unless otherwise provided in paragraph 3 of this subsection, 10 earnings from the public schools may not exceed one-half (1/2) of 11 the member's final average salary used in computing retirement 12 benefits, or the Earnings Limitation earnings limitation for 13 employees allowed by the Social Security Administration, whichever 14 is less. For retired members under the age of sixty-two (62) years, 15 the limit on allowed earnings from the public schools of Oklahoma 16 for employment for the performance of duties ordinarily performed by 17 classified or nonclassified personnel shall be the lesser of Fifteen 18 Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) or one-half (1/2) of the member's 19 final average salary used in computing retirement benefits unless 20 the earnings limitation allowed by the Social Security 21 Administration would be greater than Fifteen Thousand Dollars 22 (\$15,000.00). For retired members sixty-two (62) years of age or 23 older the limit on allowed earnings from the public schools of 24

1 Oklahoma for the performance of duties ordinarily performed by 2 classified or nonclassified personnel shall be the lesser of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) or one-half (1/2) of the member's 3 final average salary used in computing retirement benefits. On and 4 5 after the effective date of this act, for retired members under the age of sixty-two (62) years, the limit on allowed earnings from the 6 public schools of Oklahoma for employment for the performance of 7 duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel 8 9 shall be the lesser of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) or onehalf (1/2) of the member's final average salary used in computing 10 retirement benefits unless the earnings limitation allowed by the 11 12 Social Security Administration would be greater than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00). On and after the effective date of this act, 13 for retired members sixty-two (62) years of age or older, the limit 14 on allowed earnings from the public schools of Oklahoma for the 15 performance of duties ordinarily performed by classified or 16 nonclassified personnel shall be the lesser of Fifty-five Thousand 17 Dollars (\$55,000.00) or one-half (1/2) of the member's final average 18 salary used in computing retirement benefits. For purposes of this 19 paragraph, the following shall apply: 20 a. earnings shall mean "regular annual compensation" as 21

a. earnings shall mean "regular annual compensation" as defined in paragraph (25) of Section 17-101 of this title, and shall include any payment by a public school for services rendered by a retired member who

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is employed for any purpose whatsoever. Supplemental retirement payments paid by a former public school employer pursuant to subsection 9 of Section 17-105 of this title or other state law shall not be considered as earnings,

- the Earnings Limitation earnings limitation for employees allowed by the Social Security
   Administration to workers between the age of sixty-two (62) years and sixty-five (65) years shall apply to retired members below the age of sixty-two (62) years,
- c. the limit on allowed earnings from the public schools shall be automatically adjusted effective the first day of January of each year to reflect the current 

  Earnings Limitation earnings limitation for employees as determined from time to time by the Social Security Administration,
- d. the earnings limit for the calendar year in which a member retires shall be one-twelfth (1/12) of the annual limit multiplied by the number of months the member is eligible to work and receive payments from the public schools of Oklahoma,
- e. earnings in excess of the maximum limit on allowed earnings from public schools of Oklahoma shall result in a loss of future retirement benefits for the year

Members returning under this section shall only be 16 employed pursuant to a temporary contract; and 17

A member shall be considered to be employed by a school district to perform the duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel if the member is hired by the school district in the member's individual capacity to perform the duties or if the member performs the duties through employment with a proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability company

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- or partnership, or any other business structure that has agreed or contracted to provide the services to the school district.
  - B. A public school district that employs a retired member shall be required to make contributions to the System for the retired member in an amount as required in Section 17-108.1 and in paragraph 3 of subsection B of Section 17-116.2 of this title.
  - C. For purposes of this section, postretirement employment of less than one thousand (1,000) hours per year with the Governor, the State Senate, the House of Representatives or the Legislative Service Bureau shall not be considered as postretirement employment with a public school of Oklahoma.
  - D. The Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this section.
  - E. A member who has entered into postretirement employment with a participating employer of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma must fully comply with all the provisions of the rules promulgated by the Board of Trustees pursuant to this section in order to continue receiving his or her monthly retirement benefit.
- 20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
