6 An Act relating to substance abuse services; defining  
7 term; providing certain power and duty to the  
8 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse  
9 Services; requiring certain state agencies to execute  
10 certain interagency agreements; requiring certain  
11 submission of data by state agencies and political  
12 subdivisions; requiring the Department to compile and  
13 submit certain annual report; providing for  
14 codification; and providing an effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-402 of Title 43A, unless there  
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 A. As used in this section, "emergency opioid antagonist" means  
20 a drug including but not limited to naloxone that blocks the effects  
21 of opioids and that is approved by the United States Food and Drug  
22 Administration for the treatment of an opioid overdose.

23 B. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
24 shall have the power and duty to coordinate and oversee the  
distribution of emergency opioid antagonists by state agencies.

1 C. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid  
2 antagonists, including but not limited to the State Department of  
3 Health, shall execute an interagency agreement with the Department  
4 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to coordinate the  
5 distribution of emergency opioid antagonists.

6 D. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid  
7 antagonists, or any political subdivision that receives an opioid  
8 grant award under the Political Subdivisions Opioid Abatement Grants  
9 Act to purchase emergency opioid antagonists for distribution, shall  
10 submit data to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse  
11 Services on the agency's or political subdivision's distribution of  
12 emergency opioid antagonists including geographic data, data on the  
13 entities receiving emergency opioid antagonists from the agency, and  
14 any other data requested by the Department of Mental Health and  
15 Substance Abuse Services.

16 E. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
17 shall compile an annual report summarizing and analyzing the data  
18 submitted by state agencies and political subdivisions under  
19 subsection D of this section and its own data on distribution of  
20 emergency opioid antagonists during the prior state fiscal year and  
21 shall, beginning December 1, 2025, electronically submit the report  
22 to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House  
23 of Representatives, and the Governor no later than December 1 of  
24 each year.
