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6	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Code; amending 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-103, which
7	relates to function, powers, and duties of the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission; removing
8	affirmative action plan requirement; amending 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-105, which relates to powers and
9	duties of the Director of Wildlife Conservation; removing power of Director to make a complaint and
10	cause proceedings against a person; updating statutory language; making language gender neutral;
11	and providing an effective date.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-103, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 3-103. A. The <u>Oklahoma</u> Wildlife Conservation
18	Commission shall constitute an advisory, administrative and
19	policymaking board for the protection, restoration, perpetuation,
20	conservation, supervision, maintenance, enhancement, and management
21	of wildlife in this state as provided in the Oklahoma Wildlife
22	Conservation Code.
23	B. The Director <u>of Wildlife Conservation</u> shall consult with the
24	Commission regarding the administration of the affairs of the
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Department of Wildlife Conservation. The Commission is authorized and empowered to require from the Director complete reports and information relative to the affairs of the Department at the time and in the manner the Commission may deem advisable.

5 С. The Commission shall meet in regular session at least nine times per year not to exceed one meeting per month with not more 6 than two consecutive calendar months between meetings and in special 7 sessions as may be called by the Chair or a majority of the 8 9 Commission. The Commission may hold any regular or special session at any location within this state. Should a location be chosen 10 other than Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City for a regular or 11 12 special meeting, notice shall be posted at Commission headquarters in Oklahoma City and advertised in the local newspaper of the city 13 in which the meeting is to be held, at least one time during each of 14 the two (2) weeks prior to the meeting. The advertisements shall 15 include time, date, and address of location of the meeting. 16

D. In addition to the other powers and duties prescribed bylaw, the Commission shall:

19 1. Institute an affirmative action plan for hiring women and 20 minorities throughout the agency;

21 2. Elect a chair, vice-chair vice chair, and secretary, who
22 shall perform the duties required of them by statutes, rules of the
23 Commission, and the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. The

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1 chair, vice-chair vice chair, and secretary shall receive no extra
2 compensation;

3 3. 2. Appoint a Director, and determine the qualifications of
4 the Director and all assistants and employees. A Commissioner shall
5 not be eligible for employment in any position within the
6 Department;

7 4. 3. Prescribe rules and policies for the transaction of its
8 business and the control of the Department;

9 5. 4. Develop and implement a plan to provide step raises for
10 Commission employees so that discrepancies of pay levels within a
11 pay grade are eliminated;

12 6. 5. Acquire by purchase, lease, gift, or devise, waters, real 13 property, and personal property incident to the exercise of its 14 functions and to maintain, operate, and dispose of the same;

15 7. 6. Acquire real property by condemnation only when the 16 Attorney General or other counsel deems it an appropriate means of 17 clearing title from willing or unavailable sellers;

18 8. 7. Supervise the establishment, extension, improvement, and 19 operation of the wildlife refuges, propagation areas or stations, 20 public hunting areas, public fishing areas, game management areas, 21 and fish hatcheries;

9. 8. Prescribe the manner of cooperation with the Oklahoma
Tourism and Recreation Department, colleges and universities within
the state, other state agencies, any agency of the federal

1 government, and any city, town, school district, or any other agency 2 or organization in study of conservation and propagation of wildlife and in the establishment, maintenance, and operation of visual 3 educational facilities, recreational facilities, and hunting and 4 5 fishing facilities, in the study and propagation of wildlife; 10. 9. Supervise the letting of all contracts and purchases for 6 the Department, with all purchases of personal property to be made 7 through the Office of Management and Enterprise Services; 8 9 11. 10. Authorize all claims or expenditures prior to incurring 10 payment except as otherwise provided in this Code; 12. 11. Prescribe rules on the use of Department-owned vehicles 11 12 by the Director, department heads and other essential employees as the Commission deems necessary in order to perform their duties; 13 13. 12. Prescribe rules for the sale of all regular or special 14 licenses; 15 14. 13. Publicize and encourage the conservation and 16 appreciation of wildlife and all other natural resources; 17 15. 14. Regulate the seasons and harvest of wildlife; 18 16. 15. Promulgate rules to sell fishing and hunting licenses 19 via the Internet; 20 17. 16. Annually report to the Governor and the Legislature on 21 the complete operation, activities, and plans of the Department, 22 together with such recommendations for future activities as the 23

24 Commission may deem to be in the best interest of the state; and

1 18. 17. Provide the Governor and the Legislature with an annual
 2 inventory of all property and equipment.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2021, Section 3-105, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 3-105. A. Immediately upon the appointment of the 6 Director <u>of Wildlife Conservation</u>, he <u>or she</u> shall become vested 7 with the duties and powers of the management and control of the 8 Department <u>of Wildlife Conservation</u> under such provisions, orders, 9 rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the Commission, and in 10 addition thereto shall have the following specific powers and 11 duties:

To manage and control, under the supervision of the <u>Oklahoma</u>
 <u>Wildlife Conservation</u> Commission, all wildlife refuges and real or
 personal properties which are held, operated or maintained by the
 Department-;

2. To appoint and employ such assistants, department heads, 16 rangers, clerical help and other employees as the Commission may 17 deem necessary, subject to the approval of the Commission. 18 The Director shall fix and determine the salaries and wages to be paid 19 under and subject to the rules and regulations as promulgated by the 20 Commission; and the Director shall supervise and direct all 21 employees of either the Commission or the Department and may 22 suspend, discharge, station or transfer them at any time that, in 23

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1 his <u>or her</u> judgment, the Commission or the state will be best served 2 thereby<del>.;</del>

3 3. To approve or disapprove and pay all legal claims for
4 services rendered or expenses incurred by rangers and other
5 employees of the Department in accordance with the schedules
6 therefor and the rules and regulations previously adopted by the
7 Commission-;

8 4. To establish and maintain a proper system of bookkeeping and
9 accounting under the supervision of the State Auditor and
10 Inspector-;

5. To promote and manage wildlife propagation by raising and distributing the same over the state at the direction of the Commission; to capture, propagate, transport, buy, sell or exchange any species of fish, game, furbearing animals and protected birds needed for stocking the lands or waters of the state; and to feed, provide and care for such fish, animals and birds-; and

6. To make a complaint and cause proceedings to be commenced 17 against any person for violation of any of the laws for the 18 conservation of wildlife with the sanction of the district attorney 19 of the county in which such proceedings are brought, and shall not 20 be required to give security for costs. The Director may also 21 appear in behalf of the people in any court of competent 22 jurisdiction in any prosecution for a violation of any of the laws 23 for the protection of wildlife, and may prosecute the same in the 24

1	same manner and with the same authority as the district attorney of
2	the county where such proceedings are pending in cases where such
3	attorney is unable to be present or refuses to prosecute such case.
4	<del>7.</del> To make emergency purchases of equipment, materials and
5	supplies under rules and regulations prescribed by the Commission.
6	B. All duties and authority imposed or conferred upon the
7	former <del>Wildlife Conservation</del> Director <u>of Wildlife Conservation</u> by
8	any statute, rule or regulation of the Commission are hereby imposed
9	and conferred upon the Director until such time as the Commission or
10	the Legislature shall, by appropriate measure, change such duties or
11	authority imposed by <del>said</del> <u>the</u> Commission.
12	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
