1 ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 966 By: Coleman and Hamilton of the 2 Senate 3 and Ford of the House 4 5 An Act relating to statewide radio systems; amending 6 62 O.S. 2021, Section 35.6.2, which relates to the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety Interoperability 7 Cooperative; requiring certain plan creation and transmission; adding references to the Statewide 8 Radio Strategic Plan and the Statewide Interoperable 9 Radio Communications Governance Body; creating the Statewide Interoperable Radio Communications Governance Body; creating membership; directing the 10 election of the chairperson; creating the Statewide Public Safety Interoperable Radio Communications 11 System Revolving Fund; updating statutory language; providing for codification; and providing an 12 effective date. 13 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 35.6.2, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 35.6.2. A. In order to comply with Executive Orders 18 and federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements related 19 to interoperable public safety communications and to support the 20 critical mission and purposes of the agencies within the Oklahoma 21 Safety and Security Cabinet, the Transportation Cabinet and the 22 Finance, Administration and Information Technology Cabinet, there is 23

hereby established the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety

1 Interoperability Cooperative. The Land Mobile Radio Public Safety 2 Interoperability Cooperative shall be governed by a committee initially consisting of the Secretary of Finance, Administration and 3 Information Technology or designee, the Secretary of Transportation 4 5 or designee and the Secretary of Safety and Security or designee. The Cooperative is established to focus on unifying, stabilizing and 6 enhancing the infrastructure and capabilities for land mobile radio 7 public safety system communications for the State of Oklahoma and 9 shall include representatives of other public radio system boards or committees along with future voting or non-voting public entity 10 members as deemed appropriate, nominated and agreed to by vote of 11 12 the committee members defined in this paragraph.

- B. 1. In establishing and operating the Land Mobile Radio

  Public Safety Interoperability Cooperative, the committee shall

  collaborate with other public agencies, public entities and other

  interested parties having public safety radio communications

  requirements and resources.
- 2. The Cooperative shall establish an appropriate governance model for determining priorities, leveraging state-owned or other shared services and infrastructure, identifying existing and new resources and directing new investments to facilitate reliable, statewide and fully operational public safety radio communications to serve the purposes described.

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- 3. In support of the requirements of the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act, the Oklahoma Information Services Act and the Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act, the Cooperative shall have the following duties:
  - a. enable cost savings to the State of Oklahoma through unification and enhancement of current land mobile radio public safety systems,
  - b. sustain existing interoperability of land mobile public safety radio systems,
  - c. recommend standards and protocols for land mobile radio public safety systems,
  - d. recommend standards to become P25 compliant and other common radio interoperability standards, and
  - e. establish service metrics to ensure reliable land mobile public safety services statewide in support of state, local and first responders.
- C. Actions, decisions and operation of the Land Mobile Radio

  Public Safety Interoperability Cooperative shall be performed in

  compliance with, in support of and secondary to all statutory

  duties, requirements, responsibilities and authority provided to the

  Office of Management and Enterprise Services and the Oklahoma Office

  of Homeland Security; however, the resources and mechanisms

  available to Cooperative members by ownership or through agreement

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- 1 may be collectively utilized to carry out the provisions of this 2 statute.
- 3 D. The Cooperative shall create a Statewide Radio Strategic
- 4 Plan for leveraging existing assets and evolving the technology
- 5 | platform on which the Statewide Interoperable Radio Communications
- 6 | System is based and electronically transmit a copy of the Plan to
- 7 the respective offices of the Speaker of the House of
- 8 Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the
- 9 Governor of this state within ninety (90) days of the effective date
- 10 of this act. The Cooperative shall implement the Plan in
- 11 | collaboration with all state agencies, political subdivision
- 12 entities, and other interested parties that maintain a public radio
- 13 | system in this state. The Statewide Interoperable Radio
- 14 | Communications Governance Body, created in Section 2 of this act,
- 15 | shall facilitate the interoperability of the radio system of this
- 16 state.
- 17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
- 18 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.3 of Title 62, unless there
- 19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- 20 A. There is hereby created the Statewide Interoperable Radio
- 21 | Communications Governance Body. The governance body shall be
- 22 | comprised of the following five (5) voting members:
- 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, or
- 24 designee;

- 1 2. The Director of the Department of Transportation, or designee;
  - The Director of Forestry Services, or designee; 3.
  - 4. The Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority Coordinator, or designee; and
    - The Statewide Inoperability Coordinator, or designee. 5.
  - In addition to the five (5) voting members as designated in В. subsection A of this section, there shall be one communication representative for each of the state's five (5) Regional Mutual Aid (RMA) regions. The regional representatives shall be in an advisory capacity and shall not be voting members.
  - C. The governance body shall elect from amongst the five (5) voting members and the five (5) nonvoting members a chairperson who shall call the first meeting no later than sixty (60) days after the effective date of this act. Subsequent meetings shall be at a minimum, quarterly. The chairperson shall have the authority to call meetings as frequently as necessary to facilitate the objectives of the body.
  - A new section of law to be codified SECTION 3. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.4 of Title 62, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 22 to be designated the "Statewide Public Safety Interoperable Radio 23 Communications System Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 24

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1	continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
2	consist of all monies designated for deposit to the fund. All
3	monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated
4	and may be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and
5	Enterprise Services for the purpose of awarding grants by and
6	through the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety Interoperability
7	Cooperative for the purpose of implementing and maintaining a
8	statewide interoperable radio communications system, pursuant to
9	directives provided in Section 35.6.2 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma
10	Statutes.
11	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
