6 An Act relating to statewide radio systems; amending  
7 62 O.S. 2021, Section 35.6.2, which relates to the  
8 Land Mobile Radio Public Safety Interoperability  
9 Cooperative; requiring certain plan creation and  
10 transmission; adding references to the Statewide  
11 Radio Strategic Plan and the Statewide Interoperable  
12 Radio Communications Governance Body; creating the  
13 Statewide Interoperable Radio Communications  
14 Governance Body; creating membership; directing the  
15 election of the chairperson; creating the Statewide  
16 Public Safety Interoperable Radio Communications  
17 System Revolving Fund; updating statutory language;  
18 providing for codification; and providing an  
19 effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 35.6.2, is  
22 amended to read as follows:

23 Section 35.6.2. A. In order to comply with Executive Orders  
24 and federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements related  
to interoperable public safety communications and to support the  
critical mission and purposes of the agencies within the Oklahoma  
Safety and Security Cabinet, the Transportation Cabinet and the  
Finance, Administration and Information Technology Cabinet, there is  
hereby established the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety

1 Interoperability Cooperative. The ~~Land Mobile Radio Public Safety~~  
2 ~~Interoperability~~ Cooperative shall be governed by a committee  
3 initially consisting of the Secretary of Finance, Administration and  
4 Information Technology or designee, the Secretary of Transportation  
5 or designee and the Secretary of Safety and Security or designee.  
6 The Cooperative is established to focus on unifying, stabilizing and  
7 enhancing the infrastructure and capabilities for land mobile radio  
8 public safety system communications for the State of Oklahoma and  
9 shall include representatives of other public radio system boards or  
10 committees along with future voting or non-voting public entity  
11 members as deemed appropriate, nominated and agreed to by vote of  
12 the committee members defined in this paragraph.

13 B. 1. In establishing and operating the ~~Land Mobile Radio~~  
14 ~~Public Safety Interoperability~~ Cooperative, the committee shall  
15 collaborate with other public agencies, public entities and other  
16 interested parties having public safety radio communications  
17 requirements and resources.

18 2. The Cooperative shall establish an appropriate governance  
19 model for determining priorities, leveraging state-owned or other  
20 shared services and infrastructure, identifying existing and new  
21 resources and directing new investments to facilitate reliable,  
22 statewide and fully operational public safety radio communications  
23 to serve the purposes described.

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1        3. In support of the requirements of the Oklahoma Homeland  
2 Security Act, the Oklahoma Information Services Act and the  
3 Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination Act, the  
4 Cooperative shall have the following duties:

5            a. enable cost savings to the State of Oklahoma through  
6                unification and enhancement of current land mobile  
7                radio public safety systems,

8            b. sustain existing interoperability of land mobile  
9                public safety radio systems,

10           c. recommend standards and protocols for land mobile  
11                radio public safety systems,

12           d. recommend standards to become P25 compliant and other  
13                common radio interoperability standards, and

14           e. establish service metrics to ensure reliable land  
15                mobile public safety services statewide in support of  
16                state, local and first responders.

17        C. Actions, decisions and operation of the ~~Land Mobile Radio~~  
18 ~~Public Safety Interoperability~~ Cooperative shall be performed in  
19 compliance with, in support of and secondary to all statutory  
20 duties, requirements, responsibilities and authority provided to the  
21 Office of Management and Enterprise Services and the Oklahoma Office  
22 of Homeland Security; however, the resources and mechanisms  
23 available to Cooperative members by ownership or through agreement  
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1 may be collectively utilized to carry out the provisions of this  
2 statute.

3 D. The Cooperative shall create a Statewide Radio Strategic  
4 Plan for leveraging existing assets and evolving the technology  
5 platform on which the Statewide Interoperable Radio Communications  
6 System is based and electronically transmit a copy of the Plan to  
7 the respective offices of the Speaker of the House of  
8 Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the  
9 Governor of this state within ninety (90) days of the effective date  
10 of this act. The Cooperative shall implement the Plan in  
11 collaboration with all state agencies, political subdivision  
12 entities, and other interested parties that maintain a public radio  
13 system in this state. The Statewide Interoperable Radio  
14 Communications Governance Body, created in Section 2 of this act,  
15 shall facilitate the interoperability of the radio system of this  
16 state.

17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.3 of Title 62, unless there  
19 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20 A. There is hereby created the Statewide Interoperable Radio  
21 Communications Governance Body. The governance body shall be  
22 comprised of the following five (5) voting members:

23 1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety, or  
24 designee;

1        2. The Director of the Department of Transportation, or  
2        designee;

3        3. The Director of Forestry Services, or designee;

4        4. The Oklahoma 9-1-1 Management Authority Coordinator, or  
5        designee; and

6        5. The Statewide Inoperability Coordinator, or designee.

7        B. In addition to the five (5) voting members as designated in  
8        subsection A of this section, there shall be one communication  
9        representative for each of the state's five (5) Regional Mutual Aid  
10       (RMA) regions. The regional representatives shall be in an advisory  
11       capacity and shall not be voting members.

12       C. The governance body shall elect from amongst the five (5)  
13       voting members and the five (5) nonvoting members a chairperson who  
14       shall call the first meeting no later than sixty (60) days after the  
15       effective date of this act. Subsequent meetings shall be at a  
16       minimum, quarterly. The chairperson shall have the authority to  
17       call meetings as frequently as necessary to facilitate the  
18       objectives of the body.

19       SECTION 3.        NEW LAW        A new section of law to be codified  
20       in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 35.6.4 of Title 62, unless there  
21       is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22       There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
23       to be designated the "Statewide Public Safety Interoperable Radio  
24       Communications System Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a

1 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall  
2 consist of all monies designated for deposit to the fund. All  
3 monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated  
4 and may be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and  
5 Enterprise Services for the purpose of awarding grants by and  
6 through the Land Mobile Radio Public Safety Interoperability  
7 Cooperative for the purpose of implementing and maintaining a  
8 statewide interoperable radio communications system, pursuant to  
9 directives provided in Section 35.6.2 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma  
10 Statutes.

11 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
