- 1 | writing nine history books, particularly focusing on the history of
- 2 Oklahoma, the Tribal Nations, and the relations between them and the
- 3 | state and federal governments; and
- 4 WHEREAS, in 1958, Clara Luper and students from the Oklahoma
- 5 | City NAACP Youth Council staged the nation's first nonviolent lunch
- 6 | counter sit-in at Katz Drug Store; and
- 7 WHEREAS, in the 1990s, Oklahoman and NASA Astronaut Shannon
- 8 Lucid set records for the most time in space by a woman and then for
- 9 | the longest-duration space flight by any U.S. astronaut; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Oklahoma women have made significant contributions in
- 11 other areas as well, including medicine, business, literature, the
- 12 | arts, and more; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Oklahoma joins the rest of the country in observation
- 14 of national Women's History Month during March.
