13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105, as
15	amended by Section 42, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
16	Section 6-105), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 6-105. A. Unless a legal custodial parent or legal
18	guardian has filed an objection to licensure pursuant to Section 6-
19	103.1 of this title, any person under eighteen (18) years of age $_{ m who}$
20	is in compliance with or not subject to Section 6-107.3 of this
21	title may be permitted to operate:
22	1. A Class D motor vehicle under the graduated driver license
23	provisions prescribed in subsections B through E of this section;
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2. A motorcycle under the provisions prescribed in subsection H
 2 of this section; or

3 3. A farm vehicle under the provisions prescribed in subsection4 I of this section.

5 B. Any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age may 6 drive during a session in which the driver is being instructed in a 7 driver education course, as set out in subparagraphs a, b, c, d and 8 e of paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section, by a certified 9 driver education instructor who is seated in the right front seat of 10 the motor vehicle.

11 C. Any person:

12 1. Who is at least fifteen and one-half (15 1/2) years of age 13 and is currently receiving instruction in or has successfully 14 completed driver education. For purposes of this section, the term 15 "driver education" shall mean:

- a. a prescribed secondary school driver education course,
 as provided for in Sections 19-113 through 19-121 of
 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes,
- b. a driver education course, certified by the Department
 of Public Safety, from a parochial, private, or other
 nonpublic secondary school,
- c. a commercial driver training course, as defined by
 Sections 801 through 808 of this title,

- d. a parent-taught driver education course, certified by
 the Department of Public Safety. The Department shall
 promulgate rules for any parent-taught driver
 education course, or

a driver education course certified by a state other

7 2. Who is at least sixteen (16) years of age, may, upon successfully passing all parts of the driver license 8 9 examination administered by Service Oklahoma, or an approved written 10 examination proctor, except the driving examination, be issued a 11 learner permit which will grant the permittee the privilege to operate a Class D motor vehicle upon the public highways only 12 13 between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. and while accompanied 14 by a licensed driver who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age 15 and who is actually occupying a seat beside the permittee; provided, 16 the written examination for a learner permit may be waived by 17 Service Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 18 completed driver education.

D. 1. Any person:

e.

a. who has applied for, been issued, and has possessed a
learner permit for a minimum of six (6) months, and
b. whose custodial legal parent or legal guardian
certifies to Service Oklahoma by sworn affidavit that
the person has received a minimum of fifty (50) hours

1 of actual behind-the-wheel training, of which at least 2 ten (10) hours of such training was at night, from a licensed driver who was at least twenty-one (21) years 3 4 of age and who was properly licensed to operate a 5 Class D motor vehicle for a minimum of two (2) years, may be issued an intermediate Class D license upon successfully 6 7 passing all parts of the driver license examinations administered by Service Oklahoma; provided, the written examination, if it has not 8 9 previously been administered or waived, may be waived by Service 10 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 11 completed driver education or the driving examination may be waived 12 by Service Oklahoma upon successful passage of the examination 13 administered by a certified designated examiner, as provided for in 14 Section 6-110 of this title. However, notwithstanding the date of 15 issuance of the learner permit, if the person has been convicted of 16 a traffic offense which is reported on the driving record of that 17 person, the time period specified in subparagraph a of this 18 paragraph shall be recalculated to begin from the date of conviction 19 for the traffic offense, and must elapse before that person may be 20 issued an intermediate Class D license. If the person has been 21 convicted of more than one traffic offense which is reported on the 22 driving record of that person, the time period specified in 23 subparagraph a of this paragraph shall be recalculated to begin from 24

1	the most recent date of conviction, and must elapse before that
2	person may be issued an intermediate Class D license.
3	2. A person who has been issued an intermediate Class D license
4	under the provisions of this subsection:
5	a. shall be granted the privilege to operate a Class D
6	motor vehicle upon the public highways:
7	(1) only between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00
8	p.m., except for driving to and from work,
9	school, school activities, and church activities,
10	or
11	(2) at any time, if a licensed driver who is at least
12	twenty-one (21) years of age is actually
13	occupying a seat beside the intermediate Class D
14	licensee, or if the intermediate Class D licensee
15	is a farm or ranch resident, and is operating a
16	motor vehicle while engaged in farming or
17	ranching operations outside the limits of a
18	municipality, or driving to and from work,
19	school, school activities, or church activities,
20	and
21	b. shall not operate a motor vehicle with more than one
22	passenger unless:
23	(1) all passengers live in the same household as the
24	custodial legal parent or legal guardian, or

1	(2) a licensed driver at least twenty-one (21) years
2	of age is actually occupying a seat beside the
3	intermediate Class D licensee.
4	E. Any person who has been issued an intermediate Class D
5	license for a minimum of:
6	1. One (1) year; or
7	2. Six (6) months, if the person has completed both the driver
8	education and the parent-certified behind-the-wheel training
9	provisions of subparagraph b of paragraph 1 of subsection D of this
10	section,
11	may be issued a Class D license. However, notwithstanding the date
12	of issuance of the Class D license, if the person has been convicted
13	of a traffic offense which is reported on the driving record of that
14	person, the time periods specified in paragraph 1 or 2 of this
15	subsection, as applicable, shall be recalculated to begin from the
16	date of conviction for the traffic offense, and must elapse before
17	that person may be issued a Class D license. If the person has been
18	convicted of more than one traffic offense which is reported on the
19	driving record of that person, the time periods specified in
20	paragraph 1 or 2 of this subsection, as applicable, shall be
21	recalculated to begin from the most recent date of conviction, and
22	must elapse before that person may be issued a Class D license.
23	F. Learner permits and intermediate Class D licenses shall be
24	issued for the same period as all other driver licenses. The

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1 licenses may be suspended or canceled at the discretion of the Department for violation of restrictions, for failing to give the 2 required or correct information on the application, for knowingly 3 4 giving false or inaccurate information on the application or any 5 subsequent documentation related to the granting of driving privileges, for using a hand-held electronic device while operating 6 7 a motor vehicle for non-life-threatening emergency purposes or for violation of any traffic laws of this state pertaining to the 8 9 operation of a motor vehicle.

10 G. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules establishing 11 procedures for removal of learner permit and intermediate Class D 12 license restrictions from the permit or license upon the permittee 13 or licensee qualifying for a less restricted or an unrestricted 14 license.

15 Any person fourteen (14) years of age or older may apply for н. 16 a restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only restriction. 17 After the person has successfully passed all parts of the motorcycle 18 examination other than the driving examination, has successfully 19 completed a certified state-approved motorcycle basic rider course 20 approved by the Department of Public Safety, in conjunction with 21 Service Oklahoma, and has met all requirements provided for in the 22 rules of the Department and Service Oklahoma, Service Oklahoma shall 23 issue to the person a restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-24 only restriction which shall grant to the person, while having the

1 license in the person's immediate possession, the privilege to
2 operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle:

3 1. With a piston displacement not to exceed three hundred (300) 4 cubic centimeters;

5 2. Between the hours of 4:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. only;

6 3. While wearing approved protective headgear; and

7 4. While accompanied by and receiving instruction from any 8 person who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is 9 properly licensed pursuant to the laws of this state to operate a 10 motorcycle or motor-driven cycle, and who has visual contact with 11 the restricted licensee.

The restricted licensee may apply on or after thirty (30) days from date of issuance of the restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only restriction to have the restriction of being accompanied by a licensed driver removed by successfully completing the driving portion of an examination.

The written examination and driving examination for a restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only endorsement shall be waived by Service Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully completed a certified state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the Department and Service Oklahoma.

I. Service Oklahoma may in its discretion issue a special
permit to any person who has attained the age of fourteen (14)
years, authorizing such person to operate farm vehicles between the

1	farm and the market to haul commodities grown on the farm; provided,
2	that the special permit shall be temporary and shall expire not more
3	than thirty (30) days after the issuance of the special permit.
4	Special permits shall be issued only to farm residents and shall be
5	issued only during the time of the harvest of the principal crops
6	grown on such farm. Provided, however, Service Oklahoma shall not
7	issue a special permit pursuant to this subsection until Service
8	Oklahoma is fully satisfied after the examination of the application
9	and other evidence furnished in support thereof, that the person is
10	physically and mentally developed to such a degree that the
11	operation of a motor vehicle by the person would not be inimical to
12	public safety.
13	1. Any person who is less than seventeen (17) years of age but
14	is at least fourteen (14) years of age and who resides upon a farm
15	in this state or is employed for compensation upon a farm in this
16	state may apply to Service Oklahoma for a farm permit authorizing
17	such person, while possessing the permit, to operate any Class D
18	motor vehicle.
19	2. a. A farm permit shall entitle the licensee, who is at
20	least fourteen (14) years of age but less than sixteen
21	(16) years of age, to operate the appropriate motor
22	vehicles at any time:
23	(1) while going to or from or in connection with any
24	farm job, employment, or other farm-related work,

1		(2)	on days while school is in session, over the most
2			direct and accessible route between the
3			licensee's residence and school of enrollment for
4			the purpose of school attendance; provided, that
5			the privilege shall only extend to those
6			licensees who reside on a farm and commute
7			directly from their place of residence to the
8			school in which they are enrolled, or
9		(3)	when the licensee is operating a passenger car at
10			any time when accompanied by an adult who is the
11			holder of a valid commercial driver license,
12			Class A, B, C, or D driver license and who is
13			actually occupying a seat beside the driver.

7	to suspension or revocation in the same manner as any
8	other driver license.
9	b. A farm permit may be suspended in accordance with
10	Section 6-113 of this title for any violation of
11	restrictions under this subsection.
12	c. Service Oklahoma shall suspend the farm permit upon
13	receiving satisfactory evidence that the licensee has
14	been involved in two or more accidents chargeable to
15	the licensee and such suspended license shall not be
16	reinstated for one (1) year.
17	8. Any licensee issued a farm permit under this subsection
18	shall provide, prior to reaching sixteen (16) years of age, a signed
19	affidavit of either a parent or guardian stating that the applicant
20	has completed at least fifty (50) hours of adult-supervised driving
21	with at least ten (10) of those hours being at night. The adult-
22	supervised driving required by this paragraph shall be conducted by
23	an adult who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age and is the
24	holder of a valid commercial driver license, Class A, B, C, or D

"Using a hand-held electronic device" means engaging any
 function on an electronic device.

14 K. All driver education courses provided for in paragraph 1 of 15 subsection C of this section shall include education regarding the 16 dangers of texting while driving and the effects of being under the 17 influence of alcohol or other intoxicating substance while driving. 18 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 19 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
