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6 An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S.  
7 2021, Section 11-314, as amended by Section 1,  
8 Chapter 270, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section  
9 11-314), which relates to the Bernardo-Mills Law;  
10 modifying types of vehicles requiring certain  
11 approach; modifying name of offense; modifying  
12 description of person offended; defining term; and  
13 providing an effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-314, as  
16 amended by Section 1, Chapter 270, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023,  
17 Section 11-314), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 11-314. A. This section shall be known and may be  
19 cited as the "Bernardo-Mills Law".

20 B. The driver of a motor vehicle, upon approaching a stationary  
21 ~~authorized emergency vehicle, a Department of Transportation~~  
22 ~~maintenance vehicle, a Turnpike Authority maintenance vehicle, a~~  
23 ~~stationary vehicle that is displaying flashing lights or a licensed~~  
24 ~~wrecker that is displaying a flashing amber light, a combination red~~  
~~or blue light or any combination of amber, red or blue lights,~~  
shall:

1        1. If traveling on a highway that consists of two or more lanes  
2 that carry traffic in the same direction of travel as that of the  
3 driver, the driver shall proceed with due caution and shall, if  
4 possible and with due regard to the road, weather, and traffic  
5 conditions, change lanes into a lane that is not adjacent to the  
6 stationary ~~authorized emergency vehicle, a Department of~~  
7 ~~Transportation maintenance vehicle, a Turnpike Authority maintenance~~  
8 ~~vehicle, or licensed wrecker~~; or if the driver is not able to change  
9 lanes or if to do so would be unsafe, the driver shall proceed with  
10 due caution and reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a safe  
11 speed; and

12        2. If traveling on a highway other than a highway described in  
13 paragraph 1 of this subsection, the driver shall proceed with due  
14 caution and reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a safe speed.

15        A Upon conviction, a person shall be guilty of the offense of  
16 roadway endangerment ~~of an emergency worker~~ for any ~~offense~~ act or  
17 omission committed in violation of this subsection.

18        C. This section does not relieve the operator of a stationary  
19 ~~authorized emergency vehicle, a Department of Transportation~~  
20 ~~maintenance vehicle, a Turnpike Authority maintenance vehicle, or~~  
21 ~~licensed wrecker~~ from the consequences of reckless disregard for the  
22 safety of all persons and property upon the highway.

23        D. Upon conviction for committing the offense of roadway  
24 endangerment ~~of an emergency worker~~ pursuant to subsection B of this

1 section, if no injury or death of an ~~emergency worker~~ individual  
2 resulted from the offense, and in addition to any other penalty  
3 authorized by law, the person shall be subject to a fine of:

4 1. One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a first offense; and

5 2. Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for a second  
6 offense.

7 E. A person shall be deemed to commit the offense of aggravated  
8 roadway endangerment ~~of an emergency worker~~ upon conviction for any  
9 ~~offense pursuant to~~ act or omission constituting an offense under  
10 subsection B of this section when such offense results in the injury  
11 or death of an ~~emergency worker~~ individual. Upon conviction for  
12 committing the offense of aggravated roadway endangerment ~~of an~~  
13 ~~emergency worker~~, in addition to any other penalty authorized by  
14 law, the person shall be subject to a fine of not more than Five  
15 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) if the offense resulted in injury ~~to an~~  
16 ~~emergency worker~~ and not more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00)  
17 if the offense resulted in the death of an ~~emergency worker~~  
18 individual.

19 F. No person shall be cited or convicted for roadway  
20 endangerment ~~of an emergency worker~~ or aggravated roadway  
21 endangerment ~~of an emergency worker~~ for any act or omission  
22 otherwise constituting an offense under subsection B of this section  
23 if such act or omission resulted, in whole or in part, from  
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1 mechanical failure of the vehicle of the person or from the  
2 negligence of another person ~~or an emergency worker~~.

3 G. As used in this section, the term "stationary vehicle" shall  
4 include, but may not be limited to, any stationary vehicle,  
5 authorized emergency vehicle, Department of Transportation  
6 maintenance vehicle, Oklahoma Turnpike Authority maintenance  
7 vehicle, a service vehicle belonging to a utility company, or a  
8 licensed wrecker that is displaying flashing amber lights, a  
9 combination red or blue lights, or any combination of amber, red, or  
10 blue lights.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
