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6 An Act relating to schools; directing the State
7 Department of Education to develop type 1 diabetes
8 informational materials; requiring periodic update of
9 materials; mandating materials be made available on
10 Department website; requiring school districts and
11 charter schools to make materials accessible at
12 specified times; providing for content of materials;
13 providing for codification; providing an effective
14 date; and declaring an emergency.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196 of Title 70, unless
18 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 A. The State Department of Education, in coordination with any
20 other entity the Department deems appropriate, shall develop type 1
21 diabetes informational materials for parents and guardians of
22 students. The informational materials shall undergo periodic
23 updates as necessary and shall be made available to each school
24 district and charter school through the Department's website.

B. Beginning August 1, 2024, the school district board of
education and governing board of a charter school shall make copies

1 of the type 1 diabetes informational materials accessible, either
2 digitally or with printed materials, to the parent or guardian of a
3 student when the student is initially enrolled in the school and
4 when the student enters sixth grade.

5 C. The type 1 diabetes informational materials may include, but
6 not be limited to, the following:

7 1. A description of type 1 diabetes;

8 2. A description of the risk factors and warning signs
9 associated with type 1 diabetes;

10 3. A recommendation for students who display warning signs
11 associated with type 1 diabetes that the parent or guardian should
12 immediately consult with the student's primary care provider to
13 determine if immediate screening for type 1 diabetes is appropriate;

14 4. A description of the screening process for type 1 diabetes,
15 the significance of its stages, and the implications of test results
16 identifying the presence of each state of type 1 diabetes; and

17 5. A recommendation that, following a type 1 diabetes
18 diagnosis, the parent or guardian should consult with the student's
19 primary care provider to develop an appropriate treatment plan,
20 which may include consultation with and examination by a specialty
21 care provider, such as a properly qualified endocrinologist.

22 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
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SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
