17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as				
18	amended by Section 1, Chapter 306, O.S.L. 2022 (62 O.S. Supp. 2023,				
19	Section 3103), is amended to read as follows:				
20	Section 3103. As used in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation				
21	Actuarial Analysis Act:				
22	1. "Amendment" means any amendment, including a substitute				
23	bill, made to a retirement bill by any committee of the House or				
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Senate, any conference committee of the House or Senate or by the
 House or Senate;

2. "RB number" means that number preceded by the letters "RB"
assigned to a retirement bill by the respective staffs of the
Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives when
the respective staff office prepares a retirement bill for a member
of the Legislature;

8 3. "Legislative Actuary" means the firm or entity that enters 9 into a contract with the Legislative Service Bureau pursuant to 10 Section 452.15 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to provide the 11 actuarial services and other duties provided for in the Oklahoma 12 Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act;

4. "Nonfiscal amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact, which amendment does not change any factor of an actuarial investigation specified in subsection A of Section 3109 of this title;

17 5. "Nonfiscal retirement bill" means a retirement bill:
18 a. which does not affect the cost or funding factors of a
19 retirement system,
20 b. which affects such factors only in a manner which does

not:

(1) grant a benefit increase under the retirement system affected by the bill,

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1 (2)	create an actuarial accrued liability for or
2	increase the actuarial accrued liability of the
3	retirement system affected by the bill, or

- (3) increase the normal cost of the retirement system affected by the bill,
- which authorizes the purchase by an active member of 6 с. 7 the retirement system, at the actuarial cost for the purchase as computed pursuant to the statute in effect 8 9 on the effective date of the measure allowing such 10 purchase, of years of service for purposes of reaching 11 a normal retirement date in the applicable retirement 12 system, but which cannot be used in order to compute 13 the number of years of service for purposes of 14 computing the retirement benefit for the member, 15 d. which provides for the computation of a service-16 connected disability retirement benefit for members of 17 the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System 18 pursuant to Section 2-305 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma 19 Statutes if the members were unable to complete twenty 20 (20) years of service as a result of the disability, 21 e. which requires membership in the defined benefit plan 22 authorized by Section 901 et seq. of Title 74 of the 23 Oklahoma Statutes for persons whose first elected or appointed service occurs on or after November 1, 2018, 24

A nonfiscal retirement bill shall include any retirement bill that has as its sole purpose the appropriation or distribution or redistribution of monies in some manner to a retirement system for purposes of reducing the unfunded liability of such system or the earmarking of a portion of the revenue from a tax to a retirement system or increasing the percentage of the revenue earmarked from a tax to a retirement system;

8 6. "Reduction-in-cost amendment" means an amendment to a 9 retirement bill having a fiscal impact which reduces the cost of the 10 bill as such cost is determined by the actuarial investigation for 11 the bill prepared pursuant to Section 3109 of this title;

12 7. "Retirement bill" means any bill or joint resolution 13 introduced or any bill or joint resolution amended by a member of 14 the Oklahoma Legislature which creates or amends any law directly 15 affecting a retirement system. A retirement bill shall not mean a 16 bill or resolution that impacts the revenue of any state tax in 17 which a portion of the revenue generated from such tax is earmarked 18 for the benefit of a retirement system;

19 8. "Retirement bill having a fiscal impact" means any 20 retirement bill creating or establishing a retirement system and any 21 other retirement bill other than a nonfiscal retirement bill; and

9. "Retirement system" means the Teachers' Retirement System of
Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, the
Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma

Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police
 Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
 Retirement System, or a retirement system established after January
 1, 2006.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 17-116.10, 6 is amended to read as follows:

Section 17-116.10 A. Subject Except as otherwise provided by subsection F of this section, to the requirements of Section 6-101.2 of this title and any other applicable requirements of law, a member may enter into postretirement employment with a public school of Oklahoma and still receive monthly retirement benefits subject to the following limitations:

13 1. A retired member is not eligible to be employed by the 14 public schools of Oklahoma, in any capacity, for sixty (60) calendar 15 days between the retiree's last day of preretirement public 16 education employment and any postretirement public education 17 employment. For purposes of this section, the term "last day of 18 preretirement employment" shall mean the last day the employee is 19 required to be physically present on the job to complete the terms 20 of the employment contract or agreement. An employee on paid leave 21 is still considered to be employed for purposes of this section. 22 Employment under any conditions during this time, volunteer services 23 for the purpose of obtaining a paid position at a later date, or 24 payment at a later time for services performed during this time

1 period shall cause the forfeiture of all retirement benefits 2 received during the period;

2. Unless otherwise provided in paragraph 3 of this subsection, 3 earnings from the public schools may not exceed one-half (1/2) of 4 5 the member's final average salary used in computing retirement benefits, or the Earnings Limitation for employees allowed by the 6 7 Social Security Administration, whichever is less. For retired members under the age of sixty-two (62) years, the limit on allowed 8 9 earnings from the public schools of Oklahoma for employment for the 10 performance of duties ordinarily performed by classified or 11 nonclassified personnel shall be the lesser of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) or one-half (1/2) of the member's final average 12 13 salary used in computing retirement benefits unless the earnings 14 limitation allowed by the Social Security Administration would be 15 greater than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). For retired 16 members sixty-two (62) years of age or older the limit on allowed 17 earnings from the public schools of Oklahoma for the performance of 18 duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel 19 shall be the lesser of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) or one-20 half (1/2) of the member's final average salary used in computing 21 retirement benefits. For purposes of this paragraph, the following 22 shall apply:

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earnings shall mean "regular annual compensation" as defined in paragraph (25) of Section 17-101 of this

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1title, and shall include any payment by a public2school for services rendered by a retired member who3is employed for any purpose whatsoever. Supplemental4retirement payments paid by a former public school5employer pursuant to subsection 9 of Section 17-105 of6this title or other state law shall not be considered7as earnings,

- b. the Earnings Limitation for employees allowed by the
 Social Security Administration to workers between the
 age of sixty-two (62) years and sixty-five (65) years
 shall apply to retired members below the age of sixtytwo (62) years,
- 13 с. the limit on allowed earnings from the public schools 14 shall be automatically adjusted effective the first 15 day of January of each year to reflect the current 16 Earnings Limitation for employees as determined from 17 time to time by the Social Security Administration, 18 the earnings limit for the calendar year in which a d. 19 member retires shall be one-twelfth (1/12) of the 20 annual limit multiplied by the number of months the 21 member is eligible to work and receive payments from 22 the public schools of Oklahoma,
- e. earnings in excess of the maximum limit on allowed
 earnings from public schools of Oklahoma shall result

in a loss of future retirement benefits for the year the postretirement employment was performed of One Dollar (\$1.00) for each One Dollar (\$1.00) earned over the maximum allowed earnings amount,

f. 5 for those members age seventy (70) years and over, the earnings in excess of the maximum limit allowed 6 7 earnings from public schools of Oklahoma shall be onehalf (1/2) the member's final average salary used in 8 9 computing retirement benefits. However, any retired 10 member receiving benefits from the Retirement System 11 who reached age seventy (70) years prior to July 1, 12 1991, shall not be restricted by the earnings limits 13 pursuant to this subparagraph until January 1, 1994. 14 To qualify for the provisions of this subparagraph, 15 the member must be employed less than one-half (1/2)16 time compared to other full-time employees in similar 17 positions;

3. Notwithstanding paragraph 2 of this subsection, a retired classified or nonclassified member who has been retired for thirtysix (36) or more months and who is employed by a public school to perform duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel shall be able to receive annualized earnings from the public school with no reduction in retirement benefits regardless of the amount of annualized earnings. For a period of three (3) years

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1 beginning July 1, 2017, members who have retired as of July 1, 2017, as active classroom teachers, who have been retired and receiving a 2 benefit for at least one (1) year, and who have not been employed by 3 any public school during that one-year period, shall be eligible to 4 5 be reemployed as an active classroom teacher in common or career tech school districts, with no limitations on earnings. For a 6 7 period of three (3) years beginning July 1, 2021, members who have retired as of July 1, 2020, who have been retired and receiving a 8 9 benefit for at least one (1) year, and who have not been employed by 10 any public school during that one-year period, shall be eligible to 11 be reemployed as an active classroom teacher in common or career 12 tech school districts, with no limitations on earnings. The one-13 year period starts with the retiree's last day of preretirement 14 public education employment. Members returning under this section 15 shall not be subject to any earning limitations following the end of 16 the three-year periods described in this paragraph. Members 17 returning under this section shall only be employed pursuant to a 18 temporary contract; and

4. A member shall be considered to be employed by a school district to perform the duties ordinarily performed by classified or nonclassified personnel if the member is hired by the school district in the member's individual capacity to perform the duties or if the member performs the duties through employment with a proprietorship, partnership, corporation, limited liability company

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or partnership, or any other business structure that has agreed or
 contracted to provide the services to the school district.

B. A public school district that employs a retired member shall
be required to make contributions to the System for the retired
member in an amount as required in Section 17-108.1 and in paragraph
3 of subsection B of Section 17-116.2 of this title.

7 C. For purposes of this section, postretirement employment of 8 less than one thousand (1,000) hours per year with the Governor, the 9 State Senate, the House of Representatives or the Legislative 10 Service Bureau shall not be considered as postretirement employment 11 with a public school of Oklahoma.

D. The Board of Trustees of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to implement the provisions of this section.

E. A member who has entered into postretirement employment with a participating employer of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma must fully comply with all the provisions of the rules promulgated by the Board of Trustees pursuant to this section in order to continue receiving his or her monthly retirement benefit. <u>F. Provisions of this section that would otherwise impose</u>

21 limitations on postretirement earnings of retired members of the 22 System shall not be applicable with respect to any member who enters 23 into postretirement employment with a public school of Oklahoma from 24 the effective date of this act until June 30, 2027.

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SECTION 3. If the Emergency Clause is not approved pursuant to
 the requirements of the Oklahoma Constitution as part of this
 measure, the effective date of Section 1 of this act shall be
 October 1, 2024.

5 SECTION 4. If the Emergency Clause is not approved pursuant to 6 the requirements of the Oklahoma Constitution as part of this 7 measure, the effective date of Section 2 of this act shall be 8 November 1, 2024.

9 SECTION 5. Except as otherwise provided by Section 3 of this 10 act, Section 1 of this act shall become effective immediately upon 11 signature by the Governor or as otherwise provided by Section 58 of 12 Article V of the Oklahoma Constitution.

SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided by Section 4 of this act, Section 2 of this act shall become effective July 1, 2024. SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
