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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as
17	amended by Section 1, Chapter 306, O.S.L. 2022 (62 O.S. Supp. 2023,
18	Section 3103), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 3103. As used in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation
20	Actuarial Analysis Act:
21	1. "Amendment" means any amendment, including a substitute
22	bill, made to a retirement bill by any committee of the House or
23	Senate, any conference committee of the House or Senate or by the
24	House or Senate;

2. "RB number" means that number preceded by the letters "RB"
 assigned to a retirement bill by the respective staffs of the
 Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives when
 the respective staff office prepares a retirement bill for a member
 of the Legislature;

3. "Legislative Actuary" means the firm or entity that enters
into a contract with the Legislative Service Bureau pursuant to
Section 452.15 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to provide the
actuarial services and other duties provided for in the Oklahoma
Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act;

4. "Nonfiscal amendment" means an amendment to a retirement bill having a fiscal impact, which amendment does not change any factor of an actuarial investigation specified in subsection A of Section 3109 of this title;

15 5. "Nonfiscal retirement bill" means a retirement bill:

- a. which does not affect the cost or funding factors of a
 retirement system,
- b. which affects such factors only in a manner which does
 not:
- (1) grant a benefit increase under the retirement
 system affected by the bill,
- (2) create an actuarial accrued liability for or
 increase the actuarial accrued liability of the
 retirement system affected by the bill, or

- (3) increase the normal cost of the retirement system affected by the bill,
- which authorizes the purchase by an active member of 3 с. 4 the retirement system, at the actuarial cost for the 5 purchase as computed pursuant to the statute in effect on the effective date of the measure allowing such 6 7 purchase, of years of service for purposes of reaching a normal retirement date in the applicable retirement 8 9 system, but which cannot be used in order to compute 10 the number of years of service for purposes of 11 computing the retirement benefit for the member, 12 d. which provides for the computation of a service-13 connected disability retirement benefit for members of 14 the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System 15 pursuant to Section 2-305 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma 16 Statutes if the members were unable to complete twenty 17 (20) years of service as a result of the disability, 18 which requires membership in the defined benefit plan e. 19 authorized by Section 901 et seq. of Title 74 of the 20 Oklahoma Statutes for persons whose first elected or 21 appointed service occurs on or after November 1, 2018, 22 if such persons had any prior service in the Oklahoma 23 Public Employees Retirement System prior to November 24 1, 2015,

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- f. which provides for a one-time increase in retirement benefits if the increase in retirement benefits is not a permanent increase in the gross annual retirement benefit payable to a member or beneficiary, occurs only once pursuant to a single statutory authorization and does not exceed:
- 7 the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross (1) annual retirement benefit of the member or One 8 9 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and requires that 10 the benefit may only be provided if the funded 11 ratio of the affected retirement system would not 12 be less than sixty percent (60%) but not greater 13 than eighty percent (80%) after the benefit 14 increase is paid,
- 15 the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross (2)16 annual retirement benefit of the member or One 17 Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) and 18 requires that the benefit may only be provided if 19 the funded ratio of the affected retirement 20 system would be greater than eighty percent (80%) 21 but not greater than one hundred percent (100%) 22 after the benefit increase is paid, 23 the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross (3) 24 annual retirement benefit of the member or One

6. "Reduction-in-cost amendment" means an amendment to a
retirement bill having a fiscal impact which reduces the cost of the
bill as such cost is determined by the actuarial investigation for
the bill prepared pursuant to Section 3109 of this title;

8 7. "Retirement bill" means any bill or joint resolution 9 introduced or any bill or joint resolution amended by a member of 10 the Oklahoma Legislature which creates or amends any law directly 11 affecting a retirement system. A retirement bill shall not mean a 12 bill or resolution that impacts the revenue of any state tax in 13 which a portion of the revenue generated from such tax is earmarked 14 for the benefit of a retirement system;

15 8. "Retirement bill having a fiscal impact" means any 16 retirement bill creating or establishing a retirement system and any 17 other retirement bill other than a nonfiscal retirement bill; and

9. "Retirement system" means the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, the Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System, or a retirement system established after January 1, 2006.

2 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 49-138, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 Section 49-138. A. Any member of a regularly constituted fire 5 department of any municipality who is now serving or may hereafter serve in the Armed Forces of the United States whether such service 6 7 is voluntary or involuntary, who shall have been a member of such fire department at the time of entering such service, shall be 8 9 entitled to have the whole of the time of such service applied under 10 the provisions of Section 49-106 of this title, so far as the same 11 applies to a service pension; provided further, that the 12 municipality shall continue its payment into said pension fund, to 13 the same force and effect as though the member were in the actual 14 service of such fire department; provided, that any person who is 15 eligible for such service but who shall have volunteered for 16 military or naval service for a period not to exceed five (5) years 17 shall likewise be entitled to all of the benefits of Sections 49-138 18 through 49-142 of this title for the full period of such service or 19 enlistment; provided further, that only one such period of voluntary 20 service shall be considered hereunder. If such person shall 21 reenlist, unless required to do so by law, such person shall not 22 thereafter be entitled to the provisions of this subsection. The 23 provisions of this subsection shall not apply where any such person 24 dies during the period of said service or enlistment, and shall not

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1 entitle the surviving spouse or children to any benefits, and shall 2 not apply to any member who shall have served on active duty 3 (including initial active duty) for training purposes only and/or 4 inactive duty training.

5 Β. Effective February 1, 1997, credited service received pursuant to this section or credited service for wartime military 6 7 service received as otherwise provided by law shall be used in determining the member's retirement benefit but shall not be used in 8 9 determining years of service for retirement, vesting purposes or 10 eligibility for participation in the Oklahoma Firefighters Deferred 11 Option Plan. For a member of the System hired on or after July 1, 12 2003, if the military service credit authorized by this section is 13 used to compute the retirement benefit of the member and the member 14 retires from the System, such military service credit shall not be 15 used to compute the retirement benefit in any other retirement 16 system created pursuant to the Oklahoma Statutes and the member may 17 receive credit for such service only in the retirement system from 18 which the member first retires.

C. A member who retires or elects to participate in the Oklahoma Firefighters Deferred Option Plan on or after July 1, 1998, shall be entitled to prior service credit, not to exceed five (5) years, for those periods of military service on active duty prior to membership in the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System.

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1 documentation in such time and manner as required by the System to establish such military service prescribed in this section, or for 2 service pursuant to division (1) of subparagraph e of paragraph 1 of 3 4 subsection \in D of this section, those persons who were awarded 5 service medals, as authorized by the United States Department of Defense as reflected in the veteran's Defense Department Form 214, 6 7 related to the Vietnam Conflict for service prior to August 5, 1964. The provisions of subsection \in D of this section shall include 8 9 military retirees, whose retirement was based only on active 10 service, that have been rated as having twenty percent (20%) or 11 greater service-connected disability by the Veterans Administration 12 or the Armed Forces of the United States. The provisions of 13 subsection \in D of this section shall not apply to any person who 14 shall have served on active duty for training purposes only unless 15 discharged from active duty for a service-connected disability. 16 E. A member of the System who served in the Armed Forces of the 17 United States, or any component thereof, who was honorably 18 discharged from full-time active military service prior to becoming 19 of member of the System and whose full-time active duty military 20 service does not otherwise meet the qualifications for prior service 21 credit pursuant to subsections B through D of this section may 22 purchase up to five (5) years of full-time active duty military 23 prior service credit at the actuarial cost of service credit as 24
