9	FLOOR SUBSTITUTE
10	An Act relating to postsecondary education; creating the Captain Steven L. Farley Gold Star Families Act;
11	providing short title; providing certain tuition waivers for surviving spouses and children of certain
12	military members killed after certain date; providing eligibility; providing retention eligibility;
13	directing certain federal benefits to be exhausted prior to waiving of certain tuition; amending Section
14	1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3231), which relates to the Oklahoma National
15	Guard Educational Assistance Act; providing definitions; providing eligibility for members in
16	technology center school certificate programs; modifying requirements; creating the Oklahoma
17	National Guard Educational Certificate Program Assistance Revolving Fund; modifying source of funds;
18	modifying reporting requirements; providing for
19	promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an
20	emergency.

22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24	

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3234 of Title 70, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Captain
5 Steven L. Farley Gold Star Families Act".

B. The surviving spouse and children of a member of any branch
of the United States Armed Forces who was killed in action or killed
in the performance of his or her duty after September 11, 2001,
shall be eligible for a waiver of:

Undergraduate resident tuition, mandatory fees, and academic
 service fees at institutions within The Oklahoma State System of
 Higher Education. A student shall be eligible for a tuition and
 fees waiver for up to five (5) years or completion of the
 requirements for a baccalaureate degree, whichever comes first; or

Resident tuition and mandatory fees for a postsecondary
 program at a technology center school operating under the State
 Board of Career and Technology Education. Students shall be
 eligible for a tuition and fees waiver for up to five (5) years or
 completion of a certificate, whichever comes first.

20 C. To be eligible for a tuition and fees waiver, a student 21 shall:

22 1. Be a resident of this state; and

23 2. Have secured admission to and enrolled in an institution24 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education or a

postsecondary program at a technology center school operating under
 the State Board of Career and Technology Education.

D. To retain eligibility for a tuition and fees waiver, the student shall maintain good academic standing and satisfactory progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education or the State Board of Career and Technology Education.

8 E. A student seeking a tuition and fees waiver pursuant to this 9 section who is eligible for federal education benefits shall exhaust 10 all available federal benefits. Any amount of tuition and fees owed 11 after federal benefits are exhausted shall be waived by the 12 institution of higher education or the technology center school.

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2022
(70 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3231), is amended to read as follows:
Section 3231. A. This act shall be known and may be cited as
the "Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Act".

20 B. As used in this act:

1. "Oklahoma educational institution" means an institution of
 higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher
 Education or a technology center school operating under the State
 Board of Career and Technology Education;

2. "Eligible Guard member" means a current member of the
 Oklahoma National Guard in good standing who has a high school
 diploma or who has completed General Educational Development (GED)
 requirements and who has secured admission to and enrolled in an
 Oklahoma educational institution;

3. <u>"Certificate program" means a program offered by an Oklahoma</u>
<u>educational institution that leads to the award of a postsecondary</u>
certificate;

9 <u>4.</u> "Graduate program" means a program offered by an Oklahoma 10 educational institution that leads to the award of a master's 11 degree;

12 4. <u>5.</u> "Program" means the Oklahoma National Guard Educational 13 Assistance Program established pursuant to the provisions of this 14 section; and

15 <u>5.</u> <u>6.</u> "Undergraduate program" means a program offered by an 16 Oklahoma educational institution that leads to the award of an 17 associate's degree or a baccalaureate degree.

C. There is hereby created the Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Program to provide assistance to eligible Guard members who enroll in an Oklahoma educational institution. Subject to the availability of funds, the amount of assistance shall be equivalent to the amount of resident tuition, mandatory fees, and academic service fees for courses in which the eligible Guard member

is enrolled, not to exceed a maximum of eighteen (18) credit hours
 each semester.

3 1. The amount of assistance provided to an eligible Guard 4 member enrolled in an undergraduate program shall not exceed a 5 maximum of one hundred twenty (120) credit hours in pursuit of an 6 associate's degree and/or a baccalaureate degree.

2. Subject to the assistance for eligible Guard members
enrolled in undergraduate programs being fully funded, assistance
shall be provided to an eligible Guard member with a baccalaureate
degree enrolled in a graduate program. The amount of assistance
provided to an eligible Guard member enrolled in a graduate program
shall not exceed a maximum of forty (40) credit hours in pursuit of
a master's degree.

Assistance provided pursuant to this section shall be
 granted without any limitation other than the amount of funds
 available for the Program and the number of eligible Guard members
 who apply.

Assistance allowed by this section shall not be allowed for
 courses taken in excess of the requirements for completion of <u>a</u>
 <u>certificate program</u>, an undergraduate program, or a graduate
 program, whichever is applicable for the eligible Guard member.

D. Assistance provided pursuant to this section shall be
allocated to the Oklahoma educational institution from the Oklahoma
National Guard Educational Assistance Revolving Fund created

pursuant to Section 2 3232 of this act title and the Oklahoma
 National Guard Educational Certificate Program Assistance Revolving

3 Fund created pursuant to Section 3 of this act.

4 E. To be eligible to apply for the Program, an eligible Guard5 member shall:

1. Have at least one (1) year remaining on his or her
enlistment contract at the beginning of any semester for which the
member applies for assistance pursuant to this section;

9 2. Agree in writing to complete his or her current service10 obligation in the Oklahoma National Guard; and

Agree in writing to serve actively in good standing with the
 Oklahoma National Guard for not less than twenty-four (24) months
 after completion of the last semester for which the member receives
 assistance pursuant to this section.

15 F. To retain eligibility for the Program, an eligible Guard 16 member shall:

Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic
 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma educational
 institution in which the member is enrolled;

Maintain the requirements for retention and <u>certificate or</u>
 degree completion as established by the Oklahoma educational
 institution in which the member is enrolled;

3. Maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0scale; and

4. Maintain satisfactory participation in the Oklahoma National
 2 Guard.

An eligible Guard member seeking assistance pursuant to the 3 G. provisions of this section shall submit an application on a form 4 5 prescribed by the Military Department of the State of Oklahoma to the Educational Service Office of the Military Department prior to 6 the semester for which assistance is sought. The eligible Guard 7 member's Commander or his or her designee shall confirm a member's 8 9 standing and eligibility to the Oklahoma educational institution in which the student is enrolled. 10

H. The eligible Guard member's Commander may deny an
application submitted by an eligible Guard member for continued
Program assistance if he or she fails to comply with the provisions
of paragraph 1, 2, or 3 of subsection F of this section.

I. An eligible Guard member who has received Program assistance pursuant to the provisions of this section and who fails to comply with the provisions of paragraph 4 of subsection F of this section shall be required to repay an amount to be calculated as follows:

Determine the total amount of assistance provided pursuant
 to the provisions of this section;

2. Divide the amount determined in paragraph 1 of this22 subsection by twenty-four (24); and

3. Multiply the amount determined in paragraph 2 of thissubsection by the number of months the member did not fulfill the

requirements of paragraph 4 of subsection F of this section.
 Repayments shall be deposited into the Oklahoma National Guard
 Educational Assistance Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 2
 <u>3232</u> of this act title and the Oklahoma National Guard Educational
 <u>Certificate Program Assistance Revolving Fund created pursuant to</u>
 Section 3 of this act.

J. An eligible Guard member who has received Program assistance pursuant to the provisions of this section and who fails to comply with the provisions of paragraph 4 of subsection F of this section due to hardship circumstances may request a waiver from repayment. A waiver request shall be submitted in writing to the Adjutant General.

K. By July 1 annually, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education
shall notify the Adjutant General of the amount of funding available
in the Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Revolving Fund
created pursuant to Section 2 3232 of this act title and the
Oklahoma National Guard Educational Certificate Program Assistance
Revolving Fund created pursuant to Section 3 of this act.

L. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education <u>and the</u>
<u>State Board of Career and Technology Education</u> shall promulgate
rules to implement the provisions of this act including deadlines
for submission of applications required by subsection G of this

section. The Adjutant General may promulgate regulations to
 implement the provisions of this act.

3 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3232.1 of Title 70, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 6 for the State Board of Career and Technology Education to be 7 designated the "Oklahoma National Guard Educational Certificate 8 9 Program Assistance Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing 10 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the State Board of Career and Technology 11 12 Education from state appropriations. All monies accruing to the 13 credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State Board of Career and Technology Education for 14 the purpose of providing assistance to eligible Oklahoma National 15 Guard members pursuant to the provisions of Section 3231 of Title 70 16 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 18 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 19 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 20

SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
