



FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

[ Alzheimer's disease and related dementia - state  
plan - revolving fund - grant awards - curriculum -  
codification - repealer - effective date ]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.11 of Title 63, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Alzheimer's  
Disease and Related Dementia Infrastructure Act".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.12 of Title 63, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in this act:

1. "Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan" or "state plan" means a plan developed by the state in conjunction with stakeholders for meeting the needs of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia and their caregivers;

2. "Caregiver" means any person other than a paid provider who provides care for a person with dementia; and

3. "Dementia" means a degenerative disease of the central nervous system characterized especially by premature cognitive deterioration. This includes Alzheimer's disease and related dementia and diagnoses which are similarly marked by irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties with concomitant emotional disturbance resulting from organic brain disorder, such as:

- a. chronic traumatic encephalopathy,
- b. Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease,
- c. frontotemporal dementia,
- d. Huntington's disease,
- e. Korsakoff's syndrome,
- f. Lewy body dementia,
- g. Parkinson's disease,
- h. progressive supranuclear palsy,
- i. vascular dementia, or
- j. any other neurocognitive disorder that results in the irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties.

1       SECTION 3.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.13 of Title 63, unless  
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4       A. The State Department of Health shall compile and publish an  
5 Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementia State Plan, and shall  
6 update the state plan every four (4) years. The Department shall  
7 consult with relevant stakeholders in compiling and updating the  
8 state plan.

9       B. Components of the state plan shall include, but not be  
10 limited to:

11       1. Information on statewide coordination and service system  
12 development for Alzheimer's disease and related dementia;

13       2. Information on education, support, and other available  
14 services for Alzheimer's disease and related dementia;

15       3. Progress reports, updates, and measures of improvement or  
16 decline in relevant metrics regarding dementia diagnosis, treatment,  
17 services, and outcomes as compared to the previous state plan;

18       4. Public policy recommendations concerning Alzheimer's disease  
19 and related dementia for state policymakers; and

20       5. Information on all grant awardees, projects, and amounts  
21 awarded under Section 5 of this act.

22       C. The Department shall publish the state plan on its Internet  
23 website and shall submit the state plan to the Speaker of the House  
24

1 of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the  
2 Governor, and the appropriate cabinet secretary.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.14 of Title 63, unless  
5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
7 for the State Department of Health to be designated the "Dementia  
8 Caregiver Support Group and Education Program Development Fund".  
9 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
10 limitations, and shall consist of all monies deposited to the credit  
11 of the fund by law. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund  
12 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the  
13 Department for the purpose of awarding grants as described in  
14 Section 5 of this act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made  
15 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as  
16 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and  
17 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

18 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.15 of Title 63, unless  
20 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. The State Department of Health shall develop a program to  
22 award grants to nonprofit organizations operating in areas of this  
23 state that meet the United States Census Bureau classification of  
24 "rural" to support community efforts to establish support groups and

1 evidence-based community education programs for caregivers of  
2 persons with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia. Subject to  
3 available funding, the grants shall be awarded annually.

4 B. The Department shall develop an application process and  
5 eligibility requirements for receiving the grants. The Department  
6 shall be responsible for distributing and managing the grant awards.

7 C. The State Commissioner of Health may promulgate rules as  
8 necessary to implement this act.

9 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1280.5 of Title 59, unless there  
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 Curriculum for certified community health workers shall include,  
13 but not be limited to, training on Alzheimer's disease and related  
14 dementia.

15 SECTION 7. REPEALER 63 O.S. 2021, Sections 1-879.2 and  
16 1-879.3, are hereby repealed.

17 SECTION 8. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
