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its work or the work of workforce development 1 2 entities in the state, or to understand the impact of 3 the state's workforce efforts and programming; 4 13. To create and maintain a public dashboard and create reports with data concerning workforce development efforts in the 5 state. All state and local agencies, departments, educational 6 institutions, boards, commissions, and other public entities shall 7 8 cooperate with information and data requests from the Commission or 9 its designees. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Oklahoma Workforce Commission serve as the centralized data and 10 information repository for workforce development activities for the 11 12 state; and

13 14. To make recommendations to the Legislature to improve 14 workforce development programs in the state.

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
