





FLOOR SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to medical preceptorship training; defining terms; providing income tax credit for certain individuals who conduct a preceptorship rotation; providing amount of and basis for credit; providing limitations on credits allowed; prohibiting refundability of credit; authorizing the carry forward of credit; directing the Health Care Workforce Training Commission to award credit; limiting the amount of credit awarded to balance of certain revolving funds; authorizing allocation of partial credit; authorizing credits not allowed to be claimed in subsequent year; specifying eligibility for credit; directing the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, and the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to deposit certain fees in revolving fund for certain purpose; requiring submission of information; authorizing promulgation of rules; creating the Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund, the Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund, the Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund, and the Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund; specifying sources of funds; providing for transfer of monies to Oklahoma Tax Commission; requiring apportionment of monies; authorizing payment of administrative expenditures; stating purpose; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 697.5, as amended by Section 19, Chapter 407, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp.

2023, Section 697.5), which relates to the Health  
Care Workforce Training Commission; providing  
additional duties; updating statutory language;  
providing for codification; providing an effective  
date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2357.409 of Title 68, unless  
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this section:

1. "Advanced practice registered nursing student" means an  
individual participating in a state-supported training program in  
this state that is approved by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing for the  
training of individuals to become Advanced Practice Registered  
Nurses as defined in Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
Statutes;

2. "Faculty preceptor" means an allopathic physician,  
osteopathic physician, physician assistant, or Advanced Practice  
Registered Nurse licensed in this state and who provides primary  
care services;

3. "Medical school" means a legally chartered medical school  
recognized by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education;

4. "Medical student" means a student currently enrolled in a  
medical school in this state or a school or college of osteopathic  
medicine in this state;

1        5. "Physician assistant student" means an individual  
2 participating in a state-supported training program in this state  
3 that is approved by the State Board of Medical Licensure and  
4 Supervision for the training of individuals to become physician  
5 assistants as defined in Section 519.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
6 Statutes;

7        6. "Preceptorship rotation" means a period of preceptorship  
8 training of one or more medical students, residents, physician  
9 assistant students, or advanced practice registered nursing students  
10 that in aggregate totals one hundred sixty (160) hours;

11       7. "Preceptorship training" means uncompensated training in  
12 primary care services of a medical student, resident, physician  
13 assistant student, or advanced practice registered nursing student  
14 enrolled in a training program in this state;

15       8. "Primary care services" means family medicine, geriatrics,  
16 general internal medicine, general pediatrics, or the substantial  
17 equivalent of such services when performed by a physician assistant  
18 or Advanced Practice Registered Nurse;

19       9. "Resident" means an allopathic physician or osteopathic  
20 physician pursuing postgraduate medical education at a program  
21 supported by a medical school or a school or college of osteopathic  
22 medicine in this state; and  
23  
24

1        10. "School or college of osteopathic medicine" shall have the  
2 same meaning as provided by Section 631 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma  
3 Statutes.

4        B. 1. For tax years 2025 through 2034, there shall be allowed  
5 a credit against the tax imposed pursuant to Section 2355 of Title  
6 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes for a faculty preceptor who conducts a  
7 preceptorship rotation.

8        2. Except as provided for by subsection F of this section,  
9 credit shall be allowed for no greater than ten preceptorship  
10 rotations completed in a calendar year, and shall be equal to the  
11 following amounts:

12            a. for a medical student or resident, Five Hundred  
13                Dollars (\$500.00) each for the first, second, or third  
14                preceptorship rotations and One Thousand Dollars  
15                (\$1,000.00) each for up to seven subsequent rotations,  
16                and

17            b. for a physician assistant student or advanced practice  
18                registered nursing student, Three Hundred Seventy-five  
19                Dollars (\$375.00) each for the first, second, or third  
20                preceptorship rotations and Seven Hundred Fifty  
21                Dollars (\$750.00) each for up to seven subsequent  
22                rotations.

23        C. The credit authorized by this section shall not be used to  
24 reduce the tax liability of the taxpayer to less than zero (0).

1 D. To the extent not used, the credits authorized by this  
2 section may be carried over, in order, to each of the five (5)  
3 subsequent tax years.

4 E. The Health Care Workforce Training Commission shall award  
5 the credit authorized by subsection B of this section to faculty  
6 preceptors for preceptorship rotations of:

7 1. Medical students enrolled in a medical school in this state;

8 2. Residents who are allopathic physicians pursuing  
9 postgraduate medical education at a program supported by a medical  
10 school in this state;

11 3. Physician assistant students;

12 4. Medical students enrolled in a school or college of  
13 osteopathic medicine in this state;

14 5. Residents who are osteopathic physicians pursuing  
15 postgraduate medical education at a program supported by a school or  
16 college of osteopathic medicine in this state; and

17 6. Advanced practice registered nursing students.

18 F. 1. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce  
19 Training Commission under paragraphs 1 and 2 subsection E of this  
20 section for the tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to  
21 the Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section  
22 2 of this act during the fiscal year ending on the June 30 date  
23 immediately preceding the date upon which the applicable income tax  
24 year begins.

1        2. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training  
2 Commission under paragraph 3 of subsection E of this section for the  
3 tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the Physician  
4 Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 3  
5 of this act during the fiscal year ending on the June 30 date  
6 immediately preceding the date upon which the applicable income tax  
7 year begins.

8        3. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training  
9 Commission under paragraphs 4 and 5 of subsection E of this section  
10 for the tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the  
11 Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in  
12 Section 4 of this act during the preceding fiscal year ending on the  
13 June 30 date immediately preceding the date upon which the  
14 applicable income tax year begins.

15        4. The credits awarded by the Health Care Workforce Training  
16 Commission under paragraph 6 of subsection E of this section for the  
17 tax year shall not exceed the amount deposited to the Advanced  
18 Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund  
19 created in Section 5 of this act during the preceding fiscal year  
20 ending on the June 30 date immediately preceding the date upon which  
21 the applicable income tax year begins.

22        G. Partial claims for credit may be awarded. Credits earned  
23 but not allowed due to the application of the limitation provided in  
24 this section shall be considered suspended and authorized to be used

1 in the subsequent tax year and applied to the next tax year's  
2 limitation.

3 H. In order to receive the credit provided pursuant to this  
4 section, a faculty preceptor shall:

5 1. Claim the credit for the tax year in which the preceptorship  
6 rotation was completed;

7 2. Certify that he or she did not receive payment during the  
8 tax year from any source for providing the training; and

9 3. Supply supporting documentation as may be required by the  
10 Health Care Workforce Training Commission.

11 I. 1. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision  
12 shall reserve Five Dollars (\$5.00) of every annual licensure fee  
13 received from allopathic physicians and shall deposit the sum to the  
14 Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 2  
15 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit  
16 authorized by this section.

17 2. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision shall  
18 reserve Two Dollars (\$2.00) of every annual licensure fee received  
19 from physician assistants and shall deposit the sum to the Physician  
20 Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 3  
21 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit  
22 authorized by this section.

23 3. The State Board of Osteopathic Examiners shall reserve Five  
24 Dollars (\$5.00) of every annual licensure fee received from



1 osteopathic physicians and shall deposit the sum to the Osteopathic  
2 Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 4  
3 of this act for the purpose of providing funding for the credit  
4 authorized by this section.

5 4. The Oklahoma Board of Nursing shall reserve Two Dollars  
6 (\$2.00) of every annual licensure fee received from Advanced  
7 Practice Registered Nurses and shall deposit the sum to the Advanced  
8 Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund  
9 created in Section 5 of this act for the purpose of providing  
10 funding for the credit authorized by this section.

11 J. 1. With respect to each tax year for which any tax credit  
12 authorized by this section is awarded, the Health Care Workforce  
13 Training Commission shall electronically submit information to the  
14 Oklahoma Tax Commission, which shall include the number and amount  
15 of tax credits awarded and the name of the taxpayers that were  
16 awarded credits.

17 2. With respect to each fiscal year the State Board of Medical  
18 Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners,  
19 and the Oklahoma Board of Nursing shall electronically submit to the  
20 Health Care Workforce Training Commission and the Oklahoma Tax  
21 Commission the amount deposited in the Physician Preceptor Tax  
22 Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 2 of this act, the  
23 Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund created in  
24 Section 3 of this act, the Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax

1 Credit Revolving Fund created in Section 4 of this act, and the  
2 Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving  
3 Fund created in Section 5 of this act.

4 K. The Oklahoma Tax Commission, the Health Care Workforce  
5 Training Commission, the State Board of Medical Licensure and  
6 Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, and the  
7 Oklahoma Board of Nursing may promulgate rules to effectuate the  
8 provisions of this act.

9 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 495i of Title 59, unless there  
11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
13 for the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to be  
14 designated the "Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund". The  
15 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
16 limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board  
17 from a portion of licensure fees received from allopathic physicians  
18 under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies accruing to  
19 the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the fund shall be  
20 used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax Commission in an  
21 amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded pursuant to this  
22 act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion monies transferred  
23 from the fund in the same manner as provided by Section 2352 of  
24 Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the fund which are not

1 required for payment of administrative expenses to the Health Care  
2 Workforce Training Commission, which shall not exceed five percent  
3 (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which are not required to  
4 be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as otherwise required  
5 by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the use of the income  
6 tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this act may be used to  
7 implement programs required or authorized by law.

8       SECTION 3.       NEW LAW       A new section of law to be codified  
9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 519.8a of Title 59, unless there  
10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11       There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
12 for the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to be  
13 designated the "Physician Assistant Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving  
14 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal  
15 year limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the  
16 Board from a portion of licensure fees received from physician  
17 assistants under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies  
18 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the  
19 fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax  
20 Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded  
21 pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion  
22 monies transferred from the fund in the same manner as provided by  
23 Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the  
24 fund which are not required for payment of administrative expenses

1 to the Health Care Workforce Training Commission, which shall not  
2 exceed five percent (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which  
3 are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as  
4 otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the  
5 use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this

9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund  
11 for the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners to be designated the  
12 "Osteopathic Physician Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund". The  
13 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
14 limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board  
15 from a portion of licensure fees received from osteopathic  
16 physicians under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All monies  
17 accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and the  
18 fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the Oklahoma Tax  
19 Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax credits awarded  
20 pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall apportion  
21 monies transferred from the fund in the same manner as provided by  
22 Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Monies in the  
23 fund which are not required for payment of administrative expenses  
24 to the Health Care Workforce Training Commission, which shall not

1 exceed five percent (5%) of monies apportioned to the fund, or which  
2 are not required to be transferred to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as  
3 otherwise required by this act to offset the revenue impacted by the  
4 use of the income tax credits awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this

10 for the Oklahoma Board of Nursing to be designated the "Advanced  
11 Practice Registered Nurses Preceptor Tax Credit Revolving Fund".  
12 The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year  
13 limitations, and shall consist of the monies received by the Board  
14 from a portion of licensure fees received from Advanced Practice  
15 Registered Nurses under subsection I of Section 1 of this act. All  
16 monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated  
17 and the fund shall be used to make a transfer payment to the  
18 Oklahoma Tax Commission in an amount equal to the amount of tax  
19 credits awarded pursuant to this act. The Oklahoma Tax Commission  
20 shall apportion monies transferred from the fund in the same manner  
21 as provided by Section 2352 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes.  
22 Monies in the fund which are not required for payment of  
23 administrative expenses to the Health Care Workforce Training  
24 Commission, which shall not exceed five percent (5%) of monies

1 apporportioned to the fund, or which are not required to be transferred  
2 to the Oklahoma Tax Commission as otherwise required by this act to  
3 offset the revenue impacted by the use of the income tax credits  
4 awarded pursuant to Section 1 of this act may be used to implement  
5 programs required or authorized by law.

6 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 697.5, as  
7 amended by Section 19, Chapter 407, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023,  
8 Section 697.5), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 697.5. The Health Care Workforce Training Commission,  
10 in order to perform its official function in establishing and  
11 administering physician training programs, shall have the following  
12 specific powers, duties, and responsibilities:

13 1. To review all available data on health care workforce in  
14 Oklahoma in order to determine the current and projected  
15 distribution of physicians by geographic location and by type of  
16 practice, and, to accomplish this review, the Commission shall  
17 obtain information from and work in conjunction with the State  
18 Department of Health and all other agencies which gather data and  
19 evaluate health care workforce needs;

20 2. To review data and information on accredited physician  
21 internship and residency programs currently operated by Oklahoma  
22 hospitals and other approved clinical situations, in order to  
23 ascertain the number and distribution by physician specialty  
24 training and by geographic location of available internship and

1 residency positions and to evaluate the impact of internship and  
2 residency placement on the establishment of practices by physicians  
3 in that geographic area or similar areas within the state where  
4 their services are urgently needed;

5 3. To serve as an agent to advise hospitals, clinics, and  
6 communities on setting up and planning internship and residency  
7 programs which emphasize the provision of additional primary care  
8 physicians to service the rural areas of Oklahoma with primary care  
9 specialties to be defined to include training in the area of  
10 internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, emergency  
11 trauma, and family practice;

12 4. To provide general counsel and advice in the development,  
13 operation and evaluation of physician internship and residency  
14 programs throughout the ~~State of Oklahoma~~ this state in cooperation  
15 with the efforts of the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education  
16 and the state's physician training institutions such as the ~~Oklahoma~~  
17 ~~University~~ University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, Oklahoma City  
18 and Tulsa campuses, and the Oklahoma State University College of  
19 Osteopathic Medicine ~~and Surgery~~, and subject to accreditation by  
20 official and appropriate accrediting agencies;

21 5. To develop the criteria for determining the physician  
22 training cost component or associated clinical and hospital training  
23 costs which are or may be nonreimbursable by third party payers in  
24 programs proposed by accredited hospitals, clinical situations, or

1 hospital and clinical programs affiliated with and administered by  
2 the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of  
3 Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, or Oklahoma State University  
4 College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and Surgery~~ in order to determine  
5 the share for the state in supporting the salary, benefits, training  
6 and program administration costs incurred by hospitals in supporting  
7 of the interns and residents;

8       6. To develop the criteria and procedure by which state  
9 matching funds will be awarded to hospitals, accredited clinical  
10 situations, in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma College  
11 of Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and  
12 the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and~~  
13 ~~Surgery~~ which shall administer programs in hospital and clinical  
14 situations in the state to be used to underwrite the salaries,  
15 benefits and associated training and administration costs provided  
16 for the physician interns and residents during their period of  
17 training in such a way as to create an incentive for the development  
18 and establishment of residency and internship positions by  
19 hospitals, clinical establishments or by affiliation agreement with  
20 the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of  
21 Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma State  
22 University College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and Surgery~~ by providing  
23 funds to cover and to supplement the nonreimbursable or additional  
24 costs incurred in hospitals for training activities or for delivery



1 of service in outreach and ambulatory clinical situations which are  
2 outside but associated with the hospitals and clinical  
3 establishments participating in the program;

4 7. To review and to approve for inclusion in the programs  
5 funded the applications for funds submitted by accredited hospitals  
6 and clinical situations participating in physician training programs  
7 in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine,  
8 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma  
9 State University College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and Surgery~~ for the  
10 costs of supplying residents and interns in programs which they  
11 administer by affiliation agreements with hospitals and clinical  
12 situations throughout the state in which the interns and residents  
13 are supervised and funded by the University of Oklahoma College of  
14 Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa, and  
15 the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and~~  
16 ~~Surgery~~ and the hospitals and clinical establishments pay for the  
17 patient care services rendered in their institutions by these  
18 residents and interns during the period of training;

19 8. To determine the specific level of funding and the  
20 priorities used for granting state support to approved hospitals and  
21 clinical situations, in cooperation with the University of Oklahoma  
22 College of Medicine, University of Oklahoma College of Medicine -  
23 Tulsa, and the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic  
24 Medicine ~~and Surgery~~ for approved hospital physician training

1 programs for interns and residents and to recommend to the Governor  
2 and the ~~Oklahoma~~ Legislature the total funds needed to carry out the  
3 purpose of this program;

4 9. To employ a director and any staff personnel required to  
5 administer the funding of approved physician training programs and  
6 to contract with other state agencies and institutions to conduct  
7 and to perform specified services, functions and aspects in  
8 administering state funds on the specified cost-sharing basis  
9 determined by the Commission or for developing programs and  
10 community and institutional participation in these training  
11 programs;

12 10. To ensure that hospitals or clinical situations that can  
13 qualify in all sections of Oklahoma be utilized, and to take all  
14 steps necessary to assist such hospitals or clinics in obtaining  
15 necessary recognition or status, or in meeting standards for  
16 accreditation or affiliation so that they may participate in these  
17 physician training programs;

18 11. To ensure that in programs administered and operated by the  
19 University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, University of Oklahoma  
20 College of Medicine - Tulsa, and the Oklahoma State University  
21 College of Osteopathic Medicine ~~and Surgery~~ in hospitals and  
22 clinical situations throughout the state that funds allocated to the  
23 colleges are paid by the hospitals and clinical situations in which  
24 the patient care services are rendered, the funds are expended for

1 such purposes in funding residents and interns in the physician  
2 training programs that the colleges have established with the  
3 approved hospitals and clinical situations which programs are  
4 designed to provide primary health care services to the rural and  
5 medically underserved parts of the state;

6 12. To conduct and to administer a program of physician and  
7 health care workforce placement services throughout ~~the State of~~  
8 ~~Oklahoma~~ this state. Placement services shall be made available to  
9 communities, hospitals, health care facilities, physician and health  
10 professional training institutions, health professional associations  
11 and organizations, individual physicians, health professionals,  
12 students in physician and health professional training institutions  
13 and schools, and other interested parties in such a way so as to  
14 further the purposes of improving the distribution of physicians and  
15 health professionals practicing or available for practice in the  
16 state and improving in the availability of health care services to  
17 the people of the state. ~~Said~~ The placement service shall include  
18 but not be limited to assisting communities in matching with,  
19 contacting and recruiting physicians and health professionals to  
20 practice in communities in the state. The Commission shall develop  
21 criteria and procedures for the conduct and performance of placement  
22 services and employ any staff, contract for services with any  
23 private agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution to facilitate  
24 the performance of placement services; and

1        13. For purposes of the income tax credit authorized pursuant  
2 to Section 1 of this act and in cooperation with the Oklahoma Tax  
3 Commission:

4            a. to certify preceptorship rotations for allopathic  
5            medicine, osteopathic medicine, advanced practice  
6            registered nursing, and physician assistant training  
7            programs in this state and to register faculty  
8            preceptors who provide certified training,

9            b. to charge administrative expenses to the State Board  
10           of Medical Licensure and Supervision, the State Board  
11           of Osteopathic Examiners, and the Oklahoma Board of  
12           Nursing pursuant to Sections 2 through 5 of this act,  
13           and

14           c. to promulgate any additional rules necessary for the  
15           implementation of this act.

16        SECTION 7. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

17        SECTION 8. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
18 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
