

12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 3-101, as
14	amended by Section 2, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2023 (26 O.S. Supp. 2023,
15	Section 3-101), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 3-101. A. No election required to be conducted by any
17	county election board shall be scheduled for a day other than
18	Tuesday.
19	B. Except as otherwise provided by law, no regular or special
20	election to fill an elective office for any purpose shall be held by
21	any county, school district, technology center school district,
22	municipality, fire protection district or other political
23	subdivision authorized to call elections except as follows:
24	1. The second Tuesday of February in any year;

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1	2. The first Tuesday of April in any year;
2	3. The date of any regularly scheduled statewide state or
3	federal election in an even-numbered year as provided in Sections 1-
4	101, 1-102, 1-103, and 20-101 of this title;
5	4. The second Tuesday of September <u>August</u> in an odd-numbered
6	year;
7	5. The second first Tuesday after the first Monday of November
8	in an odd-numbered year; and
9	6. The second Tuesday of June of an odd-numbered year for a
10	special election to fill a vacancy.
11	Any political subdivision, as outlined in this subsection, that
12	has declared a state of emergency may schedule a special election to
13	take place on a date provided in subsection C of this section.
14	C. Except as otherwise provided by law or by Section 1 of this
15	act, no election for any purpose other than to fill an elective
16	office shall be held by any county, school district, technology
17	center school district, municipality, fire protection district or
18	other political subdivision authorized to call elections except on \underline{A}
19	special election called by the Governor pursuant to law shall only
20	be set on the following dates:
21	1. The second Tuesday of January, February, May, June, July,
22	August, September, <u>and</u> October and November and the first Tuesday in
23	March and April, and the first Tuesday after the first Monday of
24	November in odd-numbered years; provided, a municipality with a

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population in excess of two hundred fifty thousand (250,000)
persons, according to the most recent Federal Decennial Census, may
also hold an election on the second Tuesday of December in oddnumbered years; and

2. The second Tuesday of January and February, the first
Tuesday in March and April, the third Tuesday in June, the fourth
Tuesday in August, and the first Tuesday after the first Monday in
November of any even-numbered year, and the date of any regularly
scheduled statewide state or federal election as provided in

10 Sections 1-101, 1-102, 1-103, and 20-101 of this title.

D. In the event that a regular or special election date occurs on an official state holiday, the election shall be scheduled for the next following Tuesday. In the event that any day of a candidate filing period occurs on a Saturday, Sunday or any official state holiday, that day of the filing period shall be scheduled for the next business day.

Ε. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any provision 17 of a municipal charter, any municipality, school district, 18 technology center district, county, rural fire protection district, 19 or any other entity seeking to hold a regular or special election to 20 be conducted by a county election board on the same date as a 21 regular or special federal or state election, shall file the 22 resolution calling for the election with the county election board 23 secretary no later than seventy-five (75) days prior to the election 24

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date. A candidate filing period of three (3) days, if so required by the resolution, shall begin no later than ten (10) days following the deadline to file the resolution with the secretary of the county election board; provided, the filing period for such municipal office may be scheduled on the same dates as the filing period for state or federal office to be filled at such election.

F. Any school district, technology center district, 7 municipality, including any municipality governed by charter, rural 8 9 fire protection district or any other entity seeking to hold a special election for the purpose of filling a vacancy shall schedule 10 a candidate filing period of three (3) days to begin not more than 11 12 twenty (20) days following the date on a Monday not sooner than five 13 (5) days from the date the resolution is filed with the secretary of the county election board but not later than the second Monday 14 following the statutory deadline for filing the resolution calling 15 the election is required to be filed with the secretary of the 16 17 county election board.
