11	An Act relating to soldiers and sailors; amending 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, which relates to the
12	Oklahoma Veterans Commission; modifying appointment process for Commission members; deleting outdated
13	appointment dates; removing requirement to submit performance and financial audits; specifying members
14	serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority; providing for removal or replacement without cause;
15	prohibiting members from voting on certain issues; providing for retention of current members; directing
16	vacancies to be appointed by their appointing authority; providing an effective date; and declaring
17	an emergency.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 63.2 A. The Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall consist
24	of nine (9) members all of whom shall be honorably discharged

veterans; provided, one of the members shall be a veteran of the
 Vietnam Conflict and two shall be veterans of the Persian Gulf Wars.
 The members shall be selected in the following manner:

4 1. The state executive board or committees of the veterans' 5 organizations named in this section shall each submit to the 6 Governor its respective appointing authority a list of five persons 7 qualified to serve as members of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission. 8 All appointments shall be broadly representative of the veterans of 9 this state in terms of age, gender, and race or ethnicity. The list 10 shall be submitted to the Governor appointing authority not later 11 than three (3) months prior to the expiration of the terms of office 12 of the members of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission-;

<u>2.</u> The Governor shall name one member from each of the
 following Veterans' groups: the American Legion; the Veterans of
 Foreign Wars; the Disabled American Veterans; the National Guard
 <u>Association of Oklahoma and one at-large member, one of which shall</u>
 <u>be a veteran of the Persian Gulf Wars;</u>
 <u>3.</u> The Lieutenant Governor shall name one member from the

20 <u>4. The Attorney General shall name one member from the Veterans</u> 21 <u>of Foreign Wars;</u>

22 <u>5. The Labor Commissioner shall name one member from the</u> 23 <u>Disabled American Veterans;</u>

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1	6. The Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall
2	<u>name one member from</u> the Military Order of the Purple Heart $ au$ and <u>one</u>
3	at-large member, one of which shall be a veteran of the Vietnam
4	Conflict; and
5	7. The President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate shall
6	name one member of the National Guard Association of Oklahoma
7	American Legion and one at-large member, one of which shall be a
8	veteran of the Persian Gulf Wars. The members representing the
9	American Legion and the Paralyzed Veterans of America shall take
10	office no later than July 1, 2015. The members representing the
11	Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Military Order of the Purple Heart
12	shall take office no later than July 1, 2016. The members
13	representing the Disabled American Veterans and the National Guard
14	Association of Oklahoma shall take office no later than July 1,
15	2017. The Governor shall also appoint three members at large.
16	The executive officer of each veterans' organization operating
17	within this state shall, on or before January 1 of the year in which
18	the organization's appointee's term expires, submit to the Secretary
19	of State, the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and
20	the Speaker of the House of Representatives a copy of the
21	performance audit and the financial audit of the organization for
22	the immediately preceding fiscal year of the organization. Such
23	audits shall be conducted in accordance with auditing standards
24	generally accepted in the United States and shall clearly show the

total paid membership of the organization and shall be certified to
 by a certified public accountant. Failure to comply with this
 section shall render the organization ineligible to submit a nominee
 to the Governor.

5 в. The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Governor with advice and consent of the Senate, and shall serve at 6 7 the pleasure of the Governor their appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause. When a vacancy on the Oklahoma 8 9 Veterans Commission occurs, the organization which is represented by 10 the vacant position shall submit a list of five names to the 11 Governor. The Governor their appointing authority and the 12 appointing authority shall choose a replacement from that list. No 13 person shall be appointed by the Governor to the Commission who is 14 related by affinity or consanguinity within the third degree to any 15 person employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. Any 16 member of the Commission shall be prohibited from voting on any 17 issue in which the member has a direct financial interest. Each 18 member appointed to the Commission shall submit a financial 19 disclosure form and military history records including discharge 20 records to the appointing authority within thirty (30) days of his 21 or her appointment to the Commission. Before any member appointed 22 as provided herein shall enter upon his or her duties as a member of 23 the Commission, he or she shall take and subscribe to the oath of 24 office as required by the Constitution of this state.

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2	<u>C. Terms for present</u> members of the Commission shall continue
3	in office until the expiration of their terms and until their
4	successors are appointed and enter upon the duties of their offices
5	terminate upon the effective date of this act. The veterans'
6	organizations named in this section shall have thirty (30) days
7	after the effective date of this act to submit lists of qualified
8	persons to the respective appointing authority, and the appointing
9	authority shall have thirty (30) days after receiving the list to
10	appoint a member to the Commission. Appointing authorities shall
11	have sixty (60) days to make appoint at-large members to the
12	<u>Commission</u> . Appointments shall be made for a three-year period.
13	Any vacancy on the Commission resulting from any cause shall be
14	filled by appointment by the Governor respective appointing
15	authority for the remainder of the term as provided in this section.
16	D. No member of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall be
17	employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs during the
18	time of his or her service on the Oklahoma Veterans Commission nor
19	shall any person who served as a member of the Oklahoma Veterans
20	Commission be employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans
21	Affairs subsequent to his or her service on the Commission for a
22	period of two (2) years.
23	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation

24 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
