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7	AS INTRODUCED
8	An Act relating to schools; creating the Emerson Kate Cole Act; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-116.3,
9	which relates to school medication policies; requiring school to call 911 if Epinephrine is
10	administered to a student; mandating school to notify parent if student experiences possible allergic
11	reaction; requiring annual training for certain teachers and school employees; prescribing content
12	and method for training; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and
13	declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
18	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
19	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Emerson Kate
20	Cole Act".
21	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-116.3, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 1-116.3 A. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section
24	1-116.2 of this title, the board of education of each school

district shall adopt a policy on or before September 1, 2008, that permits the self-administration of inhaled asthma medication by a student for treatment of asthma, the self-administration of anaphylaxis medication by a student for treatment of anaphylaxis<u>,</u> and the self-administration of replacement pancreatic enzymes by a student for treatment of cystic fibrosis. The policy shall require: 1. The parent or guardian of the student to authorize in

8 writing the student's self-administration of medication;

9 2. The parent or guardian of the student to provide to the 10 school a written statement from the physician treating the student 11 that the student has asthma, anaphylaxis, or cystic fibrosis and is 12 capable of, and has been instructed in the proper method of, self-13 administration of medication;

14 3. The parent or guardian of the student to provide to the 15 school an emergency supply of the student's medication to be 16 administered pursuant to the provisions of Section 1-116.2 of this 17 title;

18 4. The school district to inform the parent or guardian of the 19 student, in writing, that the school district and its employees and 20 agents shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising 21 from the self-administration of medication by the student; and

5. The parent or guardian of the student to sign a statement acknowledging that the school district shall incur no liability as a

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1 result of any injury arising from the self-administration of 2 medication by the student.

B. The school board of each school district that elects to
stock Epinephrine injectors or inhalers shall amend the policy
identified in subsection A of this section.

- 6 The amended policy for Epinephrine injectors shall require: 1. 7 the school district to inform the parent or guardian a. of each student, in writing, that a school nurse or 8 9 school employee trained by a health care professional 10 or trained in correlation with the State Department of 11 Health's Diabetes Management Annual School Training 12 Program may administer, with parent or guardian 13 permission but without a health care provider order, 14 an Epinephrine injection to a student whom the school 15 nurse or trained school employee in good faith 16 believes is having an anaphylactic reaction, 17 b. a waiver of liability executed by a parent or quardian 18 be on file with the school district prior to the 19 administration of an Epinephrine injection pursuant to 20 paragraph 1 of this subsection, and 21 с. the school district to designate the employee 22 responsible for obtaining the Epinephrine injectors at 23 each school site.
  - 2. The amended policy for inhalers shall require:

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a. the school district to inform the parent or guardian
of each student, in writing, that a school nurse or
school employee trained by a health care professional
may administer an inhaler to a student whom the school
nurse or trained school employee in good faith
believes is having respiratory distress,

- b. the school district to designate the employee
  responsible for obtaining the inhalers and spacers or
  holding chambers at each school site, and
- 10 c. the school district to notify the parent or guardian
  11 of a student after administration of an inhaler.

12 C. The school district and its employees and agents shall incur 13 no liability as a result of any injury arising pursuant to the 14 discharge or nondischarge of the powers provided for pursuant to 15 subparagraph a of paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection B of this 16 section.

17 A licensed physician who has prescriptive authority may D. 18 write a prescription for Epinephrine injectors and inhalers and 19 spacers or holding chambers to the school district in the name of 20 the district as a body corporate specified in Section 5-105 of this 21 title which shall be maintained at each school site. Such physician 22 shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising from the 23 use of the Epinephrine injectors or the inhalers and spacers or 24 holding chambers.

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E. The school district may maintain at each school a minimum of two Epinephrine injectors and two inhalers with spacers or holding chambers in a secure location. Provided, however, that nothing in this section shall be construed as creating or imposing a duty on a school district to maintain Epinephrine injectors or inhalers with spacers or holding chambers at a school site or sites.

F. In the event a student is believed to be having an
anaphylactic reaction or respiratory distress, a school employee
shall contact 911 as soon as possible. <u>If Epinephrine is</u>
<u>administered to a student, a school employee shall contact 911 as</u>
<u>soon as possible. The school district shall notify the parent or</u>
<u>guardian of any student who experiences a possible allergic reaction</u>
as soon as possible.

14 The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State G. 15 Board of Health, shall develop model policies which school districts 16 may use in compliance with this section. The model policies shall 17 include, at a minimum, required annual training for teachers and 18 school employees who are directly responsible for students on the 19 topics of food allergies, recognizing anaphylaxis, and instruction 20 on how to administer Epinephrine. The training shall be completed 21 before the school year begins or upon hiring the teacher or school 22 employee. Documentation certifying completion of the required 23 training shall be retained in the personnel file for the teacher or 24 school employee. The training may be provided online or in-person

1 by the school nurse or a recognized food allergy and anaphylaxis 2 training program.

3 H. The State Board of Education, in consultation with the State4 Board of Health, shall promulgate rules to implement this section.

I. As used in this section:

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1. "Medication" means a metered dose inhaler or a dry powder
inhaler to alleviate asthmatic symptoms, prescribed by a physician
and having an individual label, an anaphylaxis medication used to
treat anaphylaxis including but not limited to Epinephrine injectors
prescribed by a physician and having an individual label, or
replacement pancreatic enzymes prescribed by a physician and having
an individual label; and

13 2. "Self-administration" means a student's use of medication
 14 pursuant to prescription or written direction from a physician.

15 3. "Respiratory distress" means the perceived or actual16 presence of coughing, wheezing or shortness of breath; and

17 4. "Inhaler" means a device that delivers a bronchodilator to 18 alleviate symptoms of respiratory distress that is manufactured in 19 the form of a metered-dose inhaler or dry-powder inhaler and that 20 may include a spacer or holding chamber that attaches to the inhaler 21 to improve the delivery of the bronchodilator.

J. The permission for self-administration of asthma, anaphylaxis, or replacement pancreatic enzyme medication is effective for the school year for which it is granted and shall be renewed each subsequent school year upon fulfillment of the
 requirements of this section.

3	K. A student who is permitted to self-administer asthma,
4	anaphylaxis, or replacement pancreatic enzyme medication pursuant to
5	this section shall be permitted to possess and use a prescribed
6	inhaler, anaphylaxis medication including but not limited to an
7	Epinephrine injector, or replacement pancreatic enzyme medication at
8	all times.
9	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
10	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
