The objective of this evaluation is to prepare a comprehensive report containing recommendations aimed at enhancing the benefits for electricity ratepayers in Oklahoma by assessing the impact of the SPP on Oklahoma's electricity infrastructure and recommending improvements.   Commission shall provide support to the Secretary in conducting this
- 8 B. The report shall encompass the following areas for 9 examination:
  - 1. The impact of the SPP on Oklahoma ratepayers and the level of input from the Corporation Commission regarding SPP decisions;
    - 2. Implications of SPP decisions on the Oklahoma state budget;
  - 3. The reliance of SPP base load capacity on intermittent power sources;
  - 4. The current availability of SPP base load power generation to meet existing demand;
  - 5. Future projections and adequacy of planned SPP base load power generation to meet anticipated needs;
  - 6. Overall impact of the SPP on Oklahoma's oil and natural gas companies and the state economy;
  - 7. Identification of areas requiring modification within the regulatory and statutory framework, prioritizing the best interests of Oklahoma ratepayers and taxpayers;
