If the information or indictment has not been filed upon the expiration of the five-day period to file an information or indictment, the arrested person may move the court for release from custody subject to an own recognizance bond, as provided for in Section 1108.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The expiration of the time limit to file an information or indictment shall be prima facie grounds for the release of an arrested person on an own recognizance bond, subject to the limitations on release set forth in subsection E of Section 1108.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes or as otherwise provided by law.
- D. An arrested person may move the court for release on his or her own recognizance upon the expiration of the period to file an information or indictment even if the arrested person has already had bail set by the court, as provided for in Section 1105.2 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
