9 An Act relating to schools; directing the State
10 Department of Education to develop type 1 diabetes
11 informational materials; requiring periodic update of
12 materials; mandating materials be made available on
13 Department website; requiring school districts and
14 charter schools to make materials accessible at
15 specified times; providing for content of materials;
16 providing for codification; providing an effective
17 date; and declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196 of Title 70, unless
21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. The State Department of Education, in coordination with any
23 other entity the Department deems appropriate, shall develop type 1
24 diabetes informational materials for parents and guardians of
25 students. The informational materials shall undergo periodic

1 updates as necessary and shall be made available to each school
2 district and charter school through the Department's website.

3 B. Beginning August 1, 2024, the school district board of
4 education and governing board of a charter school shall make copies
5 of the type 1 diabetes informational materials accessible, either
6 digitally or with printed materials, to the parent or guardian of a
7 student when the student is initially enrolled in the school and
8 when the student enters sixth grade.

9 C. The type 1 diabetes informational materials may include, but
10 not be limited to, the following:

11 1. A description of type 1 diabetes;

12 2. A description of the risk factors and warning signs
13 associated with type 1 diabetes;

14 3. A recommendation for students who display warning signs
15 associated with type 1 diabetes that the parent or guardian should
16 immediately consult with the student's primary care provider to
17 determine if immediate screening for type 1 diabetes is appropriate;

18 4. A description of the screening process for type 1 diabetes,
19 the significance of its stages, and the implications of test results
20 identifying the presence of each state of type 1 diabetes; and

21 5. A recommendation that, following a type 1 diabetes
22 diagnosis, the parent or guardian should consult with the student's
23 primary care provider to develop an appropriate treatment plan,
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1 which may include consultation with and examination by a specialty
2 care provider, such as a properly qualified endocrinologist.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

4 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
