NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.196 of Title 70, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 The State Department of Education, in coordination with any 21 other entity the Department deems appropriate, shall develop type 1 22 diabetes informational materials for parents and quardians of 23 students. The informational materials shall undergo periodic 24

- updates as necessary and shall be made available to each school district and charter school through the Department's website.
 - B. Beginning August 1, 2024, the school district board of education and governing board of a charter school shall make copies of the type 1 diabetes informational materials accessible, either digitally or with printed materials, to the parent or guardian of a student when the student is initially enrolled in the school and when the student enters sixth grade.
 - C. The type 1 diabetes informational materials may include, but not be limited to, the following:
 - 1. A description of type 1 diabetes;
 - 2. A description of the risk factors and warning signs associated with type 1 diabetes;
 - 3. A recommendation for students who display warning signs associated with type 1 diabetes that the parent or guardian should immediately consult with the student's primary care provider to determine if immediate screening for type 1 diabetes is appropriate;
 - 4. A description of the screening process for type 1 diabetes, the significance of its stages, and the implications of test results identifying the presence of each state of type 1 diabetes; and
 - 5. A recommendation that, following a type 1 diabetes diagnosis, the parent or guardian should consult with the student's primary care provider to develop an appropriate treatment plan,

1	which may include consultation with and examination by a specialty
2	care provider, such as a properly qualified endocrinologist.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
