13	and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2021, Section 351.1, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	Section 351.1 A. The board of county commissioners of each
20	county may enter into agreements with any municipality for the
21	furnishing of fire protection and emergency services, including, but
22	not limited to, medical attention and wreck removal, by said
23	municipality for all persons and property in areas outside the
24	corporate limits of such municipality and to pay for such services a

1 reasonable amount on a per run basis, or such other equitable basis 2 as may be agreed upon, and to pay for such services from funds of the county general fund or the county highway fund. The board of 3 4 county commissioners of each county may also enter into reciprocal 5 agreements with other counties for such services. The board of 6 county commissioners shall also have the authority to collect 7 charges for such services performed by a municipality or another 8 county, pursuant to the provision of this section, from any person 9 to whom such services are provided. Said funds shall be disbursed 10 to the entities providing services.

11 Β. Should a disagreement over service areas arise between 12 jurisdictions providing services, with or without an agreement as 13 described in subsection A, either entity may petition for 14 arbitration by the Fire Marshal's Commission to determine boundary 15 lines for the entities involved. In making a determination, the 16 Fire Marshal's Commission shall consider but is not limited to, the 17 importance of a quick response time, the financial burden on both 18 the service providers and the jurisdiction receiving services, and 19 the capabilities of both jurisdictions to render services. 20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024. 21 22

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1	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
