8 AS INTRODUCED

9 A Resolution congratulating the University of
10 Oklahoma Sooners softball team for winning the 2022
11 National Collegiate Athletic Association Women's
12 College World Series.

14 WHEREAS, the University of Oklahoma Sooners swept the University
15 of Texas on June 8 and 9, 2022 to win the 2022 Women's College World
16 Series by a combined score of 26-6;

17 WHEREAS, the Sooners softball team finished the season with 59
18 wins and 3 losses, including a 38-game winning streak to start the
19 season that set a Division I softball record;

20 WHEREAS, the Sooners softball team led the nation during the
21 2022 season in team batting average, on-base percentage, home runs
22 and earned run average;

23 WHEREAS, the Sooners softball team has won four national
24 championships in the past six years;

1 WHEREAS, Jocelyn Alo was named the Honda Sport Award Winner for
2 Softball, back-to-back USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year
3 and Big 12 Player of the Year for Softball, and Most Outstanding
4 Player in the 2022 Women's College World Series, in which she went
5 12-for-18 with 5 home runs and 13 runs batted in;

6 WHEREAS, Tiare Jennings set a Women's College World Series
7 record with 15 runs batted in;

8 WHEREAS, true freshman pitcher Jordy Bahl finished with a 22-1
9 record, a 1.09 ERA and 205 strikeouts in 141 1/3 innings; and

10 WHEREAS, head coach Patty Gasso has become a distinguished coach
11 and leader in the softball community, leading the Sooners to six
12 national championships and more than 1,400 wins.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
14 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

15 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives expresses profound
16 appreciation to Coach Patty Gasso and the 2022 OU Softball Team for
17 the pride they bring to the State of Oklahoma.
