9	A Resolution declaring May 3, 2023, as the 7th annual
10	Hispanic Cultural Day in Oklahoma; and recognizing the heritage, culture, and contributions of Hispanics
11	to the State of Oklahoma.

13	WHEREAS, Hispanics are those who identify their origin as the
14	heritage, nationality group, lineage, or country of their birth or
15	that of their parents or ancestors before their arrival into the
16	United States; and
17	WHEREAS, Spanish-speaking countries include Argentina, Bolivia,
18	Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El
19	Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, México, Nicaragua, Panamá, Paraguay,
20	Perú, Spain, Uruguay, Venezuela, and the Commonwealth of Puerto
21	Rico; and
22	WHEREAS, Hispanics have been a part of the geography and history
23	of Oklahoma since the 16th Century when the Spanish initially
24	claimed Oklahoma, specifically the Oklahoma Panhandle; and

1 WHEREAS, the first exploration of Oklahoma was led by the 2 Spaniard Francisco Vásquez de Coronado and his army in 1541 on their journey to conquer the Seven Cities of Cíbola or Quivira, the area 3 4 known today as Cimarron County; and 5 WHEREAS, the majority of Oklahoma's Hispanic population live in 6 the cities of Oklahoma City, Tulsa, and Guymon; and WHEREAS, Hispanics have migrated to the State of Oklahoma hoping 7 8 for better lives than the ones they left behind; and 9 WHEREAS, the influence of Hispanics in Oklahoma is a result of 10 their perseverance through hard times as well as their innate 11 yearning to establish a sense of place. 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 13 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE: 14 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives declares May 3, 2023, 15 as the 7th annual Hispanic Cultural Day in Oklahoma. 16 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives recognizes the 17 heritage, culture, and immense contributions of Hispanics to the 18 State of Oklahoma. 19 20 DIRECT TO CALENDAR. 21 22 23 24
