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9	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Veterans Commission; amending 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, which relates to
10	members of the Commission; eliminating certain limitations on membership; modifying procedures for
11	appointment of members representing veterans' organizations; modifying qualifications of at-large
12	<pre>members; decreasing required number of appointee submissions; modifying requirements for submission of</pre>
13	certain information by veterans' organization; establishing certain appointment procedure in case of
14	noncompliance by veterans' organizations; specifying and modifying certain procedures for filling of
15	<pre>vacancies; specifying beginning and expiration date of terms; imposing term limit on membership;</pre>
16	clarifying language; authorizing acting or interim appointments under certain conditions; and declaring
17	an emergency.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
21	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, is
22	amended to read as follows:
23	Section 63.2. <u>A.</u> The Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall
24	consist of nine (9) members $_{\underline{\prime}}$ all of whom shall be honorably

1	discharged veterans; provided, one of the members shall be a veteran
2	of the Vietnam Conflict and two shall be veterans of the Persian
3	Gulf Wars. The members shall be selected in the following manner:
4	The state executive board or committees of the veterans'
5	organizations named in this section shall each submit to the
6	Governor a list of five persons qualified to serve as members of the
7	Oklahoma Veterans Commission. The members of the Commission shall
8	be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the
9	Senate and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. All
10	appointments shall be broadly representative of the veterans of this
11	state in terms of age, gender, and race or ethnicity. The list
12	shall be submitted to the Governor not later than three (3) months
13	prior to the expiration of the terms of office of the members of the
14	Oklahoma Veterans Commission. The Governor shall name one member
15	from each of the following Veterans' groups: the American Legion;
16	the Veterans of Foreign Wars; the Disabled American Veterans; the
17	Paralyzed Veterans of America; the Military Order of the Purple
18	Heart; and the National Guard Association of Oklahoma. The members
19	representing the American Legion and the Paralyzed Veterans of
20	America shall take office no later than July 1, 2015. The members
21	representing the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Military Order of
22	the Purple Heart shall take office no later than July 1, 2016. The
23	members representing the Disabled American Veterans and the National

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1	Guard Association of Oklahoma shall take office no later than July
2	<del>1, 2017</del> .
3	B. 1. Except as provided by paragraph 3 of subsection C of
4	this section, the Governor shall appoint six of the members from
5	lists of names provided by the executive officer of each of the
6	following veterans' organizations in accordance with paragraph 1 of
7	subsection C of this section:
8	a. the American Legion,
9	b. the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States,
10	c. the Disabled American Veterans,
11	d. the Paralyzed Veterans of America,
12	e. the Military Order of the Purple Heart, and
13	f. the National Guard Association of Oklahoma.
14	2. The Governor shall also appoint three members at large, at
15	least one of whom shall have completed his or her military service
16	on or after September 11, 2001.
17	The executive officer of each veterans' organization operating
18	within this state shall, on
19	C. Appointments to the Commission for the six members
20	representing veterans' organizations shall be made as prescribed by
21	this subsection.
22	<u>1. On</u> or before <del>January</del> <u>March</u> 1 of the year in which the <u>term</u>
23	of the organization's appointee's term appointee expires, the
24	executive officer of the organization shall submit to the Secretary

1	<del>of State,</del> the	Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and
2	the Speaker o	f the House of Representatives a copy of the
3	<del>performance a</del>	udit and the financial audit of the organization for
4	the immediate	ly preceding fiscal year of the organization. Such
5	audits shall	be conducted in accordance with auditing standards
6	generally acc	epted in the United States and shall clearly show the
7	total paid me	mbership of the organization and shall be certified to
8	<del>by a certifie</del>	d public accountant. Failure the following:
9	<u>a.</u>	a list of three persons qualified to serve as members
10		of the Commission,
11	<u>b.</u>	a certificate of good standing for the organization
12		issued by the Secretary of State,
13	<u>c.</u>	a copy of the organization's state and federal tax
14		returns for the immediately preceding tax year
15		including but not limited to the federal Return of
16		Organization Exempt From Income Tax (Form 990), and
17	<u>d.</u>	a statement that describes the mission of the
18		organization and the services provided by the
19		organization and estimates to the best of the
20		executive officer's knowledge the total number of
21		veterans the organization served in the preceding
22		<u>calendar year.</u>
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1	2. For each veterans' organization that complies with paragraph
2	1 of this subsection, the Governor shall appoint a member to the
3	Commission from the list of names provided by the organization.
4	3. If the organization fails to comply with this section shall
5	render the organization ineligible to submit a nominee to the
6	Governor. The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the
7	Governor with advice and consent of the Senate, and shall serve at
8	the pleasure of the Governor paragraph 1 of this subsection, the
9	Governor may appoint a member at large in lieu of a member
10	representing the particular organization for the duration of the
11	term. At the conclusion of the term, the appointment shall revert
12	to an appointee representing the particular organization, subject to
13	the requirements and process provided by this subsection.
14	D. Any vacancy on the Commission resulting from any cause shall
15	be filled by appointment by the Governor for the remainder of the
16	term as provided by this subsection.
17	1. When a vacancy of one of the three at-large members on the
18	Commission occurs, the Governor shall promptly appoint a member at
19	large to fill the vacancy.
20	2. When a vacancy of one of the six members representing
21	veterans' organizations on the Oklahoma Veterans Commission occurs,
22	the <u>executive officer of the</u> organization <del>which is</del> represented by
23	the vacant position shall, not later than thirty (30) days after the
24	vacancy occurs, submit a list of five three names of qualified

1 persons and all other information required by paragraph 1 of 2 subsection C of this section to the Governor. The 3. For each veterans' organization that complies with paragraph 3 4 2 of this subsection, the Governor shall choose a replacement from 5 that the list provided by the organization. If the organization fails to comply with paragraph 2 of this subsection, the Governor 6 may appoint a member at large in lieu of a member representing the 7 particular organization for the remainder of the unexpired term. At 8 9 the conclusion of the term, the appointment shall revert to an 10 appointee representing the particular organization, subject to the requirements and process provided by subsection C of this section. 11 12 E. Current members of the Commission shall continue in office 13 until the expiration of their terms and until their successors are appointed and enter upon the duties of their offices. 14 F. Appointments shall be made for terms of three (3) years. 15 Terms shall begin and expire on July 1 of the respective years. 16 No 17 member shall serve for more than two consecutive full terms. No person shall be appointed by the Governor who is 18 G. 1. related by affinity or consanguinity within the third degree to any 19 person employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. 20 2. Before any member appointed as provided herein shall enter 21 upon his or her duties as a member of the Commission, he or she 22 shall take and subscribe to the oath of office as required by the 23 Constitution of this state. 24

Present members of the Commission shall continue in office until the expiration of their terms and until their successors are appointed and enter upon the duties of their offices. Appointments shall be made for a three-year period. Any vacancy on the Commission resulting from any cause shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the remainder of the term as provided in this section.

8 <u>3.</u> No member of the <del>Oklahoma Veterans</del> Commission shall be 9 employed by the <del>Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs</del> <u>Department</u> 10 during the time of his or her service on the <del>Oklahoma Veterans</del> 11 Commission nor shall any person who served as a member of the 12 <del>Oklahoma Veterans</del> Commission be employed by the <del>Oklahoma Department</del> 13 <del>of Veterans Affairs</del> <u>Department</u> subsequent to his or her service on 14 the Commission for a period of two (2) years.

H. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person whose 15 nomination has been submitted to the Legislature to fill a vacancy 16 17 on the Commission that existed as of the effective date of this act may be appointed to the Commission on an acting or interim basis, 18 may assume the duties of the office, and may receive any 19 compensation or travel reimbursement allowed by law for the position 20 pending confirmation by the Senate if the term of the former member 21 whose position is vacant has expired as of the effective date of 22 this act and if the nominee meets the qualifications prescribed by 23 24 this section.
