9	An Act relating to public health; amending 63 O.S.
10	2021, Section 7301, which relates to diabetes prevention reporting; modifying reporting period;
11	requiring submission to Governor; requiring submission of components of report under certain
12	conditions; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective
13	date.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 7301. A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the
19	State Department of Health shall collaborate to identify benchmarks
20	and develop goals to reduce the incidence rates of, improve health
21	care services for, and control complications resulting from
22	diabetes.
23	B. The Authority and the Department shall submit a report to
24	the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and, the Speaker of the

House of Representatives, and the Governor by January 10th of oddnumbered years January 10 of every fifth year. Such report shall contain the following information:

The fiscal impact of all types of diabetes on the Authority,
 the Department, and county health departments including the number
 of persons with diabetes receiving services through the Authority,
 the Department, and county health departments;

8 2. The fiscal impact of diabetes on the Authority, the
9 Department, and county health departments in comparison to other
10 chronic diseases;

An assessment of the benefits of diabetes prevention
 programs including a summary of funding directed to the Authority
 and the Department from the Oklahoma State Legislature;

4. A description of coordination between the Authority and the
Department including, but not limited to, programs relating to the
treatment and prevention of all forms of diabetes;

Detailed action plans for battling diabetes with actionable
items for consideration by the Legislature including, but not
limited to, steps to reduce the impact of diabetes, pre-diabetes,
and related diabetes complications;

Identification of expected outcomes of the action steps and
 benchmarks for controlling and preventing all forms of diabetes; and
 The development of a detailed budget blueprint identifying
 needs, costs, and resources required to implement the plan provided

1 for in this act <u>section</u>. Such blueprint shall include a budget 2 range for all options presented in the plan for consideration by the 3 Legislature.

In addition to the complete report required by subsection B 5 of this section, the Authority or the Department shall, to the extent practicable, provide components of the upcoming report as 6 7 listed in subsection B of this section upon request to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 8 9 Representatives, and the Governor. 10 D. The provisions of this act section shall be limited to diabetes information, data, initiatives, and programs within the 11 12 Authority and the Department prior to the effective date of this act 13 November 1, 2015, unless there is available funding for diabetes in each agency that may be used for new research, data collection 14 reporting or other requirements of this act section. 15 SECTION 2.
