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9 An Act relating to public health; amending 63 O.S.
10 2021, Section 7301, which relates to diabetes
11 prevention reporting; modifying reporting period;
12 requiring submission to Governor; requiring
13 submission of components of report under certain
14 conditions; updating statutory language; updating
15 statutory references; and providing an effective
16 date.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 7301. A. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority and the
21 State Department of Health shall collaborate to identify benchmarks
22 and develop goals to reduce the incidence rates of, improve health
23 care services for, and control complications resulting from
24 diabetes.

25 B. The Authority and the Department shall submit a report to
26 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate ~~and~~, the Speaker of the

1 House of Representatives, and the Governor by January 10th of odd-
2 ~~numbered years~~ January 10 of every fifth year. Such report shall
3 contain the following information:

4 1. The fiscal impact of all types of diabetes on the Authority,
5 the Department, and county health departments including the number
6 of persons with diabetes receiving services through the Authority,
7 the Department, and county health departments;

8 2. The fiscal impact of diabetes on the Authority, the
9 Department, and county health departments in comparison to other
10 chronic diseases;

11 3. An assessment of the benefits of diabetes prevention
12 programs including a summary of funding directed to the Authority
13 and the Department from the ~~Oklahoma State~~ Legislature;

14 4. A description of coordination between the Authority and the
15 Department including, but not limited to, programs relating to the
16 treatment and prevention of all forms of diabetes;

17 5. Detailed action plans for battling diabetes with actionable
18 items for consideration by the Legislature including, but not
19 limited to, steps to reduce the impact of diabetes, pre-diabetes,
20 and related diabetes complications;

21 6. Identification of expected outcomes of the action steps and
22 benchmarks for controlling and preventing all forms of diabetes; and

23 7. The development of a detailed budget blueprint identifying
24 needs, costs, and resources required to implement the plan provided

1 for in this ~~act~~ section. Such blueprint shall include a budget
2 range for all options presented in the plan for consideration by the
3 Legislature.

4 C. In addition to the complete report required by subsection B
5 of this section, the Authority or the Department shall, to the
6 extent practicable, provide components of the upcoming report as
7 listed in subsection B of this section upon request to the President
8 Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
9 Representatives, and the Governor.

10 D. The provisions of this ~~act~~ section shall be limited to
11 diabetes information, data, initiatives, and programs within the
12 Authority and the Department prior to ~~the effective date of this act~~
13 November 1, 2015, unless there is available funding for diabetes in
14 each agency that may be used for new research, data collection
15 reporting or other requirements of this ~~act~~ section.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
