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12	An Act relating to Oklahoma Veterans Commission; amending 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, which relates to
13	the Oklahoma Veterans Commission; modifying appointment process for Commission members; deleting
14	obsolete language; removing requirement to submit performance and financial audits; specifying members
15	serve at the pleasure of their appointing authority; providing for removal or replacement without cause;
16 17	directing vacancies to be appointed by their appointing authority; prohibiting members from voting on certain issues; requiring submission of certain
17	information within a certain time period; providing for termination of current members' terms; providing
19	staggered terms of office; amending 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.3, which relates to the powers and duties
20	of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission; requiring the advice and consent of the Senate for appointing an
21	executive director; and declaring an emergency.
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23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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1SECTION 1.AMENDATORY72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.2, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 63.2 <u>A.</u> The Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall consist of nine (9) members all of whom shall be honorably discharged veterans; provided, one of the members shall be a veteran of the Vietnam Conflict and two shall be veterans of the Persian Gulf Wars. The members shall be selected in the following manner:

1. The state executive board or committees of the veterans' 8 9 organizations named in this section shall each submit to the Governor their respective appointing authority a list of five 10 persons qualified to serve as members of the Oklahoma Veterans 11 12 Commission. All appointments shall be broadly representative of to reflect the best interests of veterans of this state in terms of 13 age, gender, and race or ethnicity. The list shall be submitted to 14 the Governor appointing authority not later than three (3) months 15 prior to the expiration of the terms of office of the members of the 16 Oklahoma Veterans Commission -; 17

18 <u>2.</u> The Governor shall name one member <u>at large and one member</u> 19 from each of the following Veterans' <u>veterans'</u> groups: the American 20 Legion; the Veterans of Foreign Wars; the Disabled American 21 Veterans; the Paralyzed Veterans of America; and the Military Order 22 of the Purple Heart; and the National Guard Association of Oklahoma. 23 The members representing the American Legion and the Paralyzed 24 Veterans of America shall take office no later than July 1, 2015.

 Military Order of the Purple Heart shall take office no later than
 July 1, 2016. The members representing the Disabled American
 Veterans and the National Guard Association of Oklahoma shall take
 office no later than July 1, 2017. The Governor shall also appoint
 three members at large.

The executive officer of each veterans' organization operating 7 within this state shall, on or before January 1 of the year in which 8 9 the organization's appointee's term expires, submit to the Secretary 10 of State, the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a copy of the 11 12 performance audit and the financial audit of the organization for 13 the immediately preceding fiscal year of the organization. Such audits shall be conducted in accordance with auditing standards 14 generally accepted in the United States and shall clearly show the 15 total paid membership of the organization and shall be certified to 16 by a certified public accountant. Failure to comply with this 17 section shall render the organization ineligible to submit a nominee 18 to the Governor. At least one of the Governor's appointments shall 19 be a veteran of the Persian Gulf Wars; 20 3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall name one 21 at-large member and one member from each of the following veterans' 22 groups: the American Legion and the National Guard Association of 23

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1 Oklahoma. At least one of the Speaker's appointments shall be a 2 veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; and

<u>4. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall name one at-</u>
<u>large member and one member from each of the following veterans'</u>
<u>groups: the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Disabled American</u>
<u>Veterans. At least one of the President Pro Tempore's appointments</u>
shall be a veteran of the Persian Gulf Wars.

The members of the Commission shall be appointed by the 8 Β. 9 Governor with advice and consent of the Senate, their appointing 10 authority and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor their 11 appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause. 12 When a vacancy on the Oklahoma Veterans Commission occurs, the organization which is represented by the vacant position shall 13 submit a list of five names to the Governor. The Governor their 14 appointing authority and the appointing authority shall choose a 15 replacement from that list. No person shall be appointed by the 16 Governor to the Commission who is related by affinity or 17 consanguinity within the third degree to any person employed by the 18 Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. Any member of the 19 Commission shall be prohibited from voting on any issue in which the 20 member has a direct financial interest. Each member appointed to 21 the Commission shall submit a financial disclosure form and military 22 history records including discharge records to the appointing 23 authority within thirty (30) days of his or her appointment to the 24

1 <u>Commission.</u> Before any member appointed as provided herein shall 2 enter upon his or her duties as a member of the Commission, he or 3 she shall take and subscribe to the oath of office as required by 4 the Constitution of this state.

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C. Terms for present members of the Commission shall continue 6 in office until the expiration of their terms and until their 7 successors are appointed and enter upon the duties of their offices 8 9 terminate ninety (90) days after the effective date of this act. 10 The veterans' organizations named in this section shall have thirty 11 (30) days after the effective date of this act to submit lists of 12 qualified persons to the respective appointing authority, and the appointing authority shall have thirty (30) days after receiving the 13 list to appoint a member to the Commission. Appointing authorities 14 shall have sixty (60) days to appoint at-large members to the 15 Commission. 16 D. Appointments to the Oklahoma Veterans Commission after the 17 effective date of this act shall be made as provided in this 18

19 section. The initial staggered terms of office of persons appointed

- 20 after the effective date of this act shall be as follows:
- 21 <u>1. The initial terms of office of the persons appointed by the</u> 22 Governor shall expire December 31, 2023;
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<u>2. The initial terms of office of the persons appointed by the</u>
 <u>Speaker of the House of Representatives shall expire December 31,</u>
 2024; and

<u>3. The initial terms of office of the persons appointed by the</u>
<u>President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall expire December 31, 2025.</u>
Appointments <u>made after the expiration of the initial terms</u> shall be
made for a three-year period. Any vacancy on the Commission
resulting from any cause shall be filled by appointment by the
<u>Governor respective appointing authority</u> for the remainder of the
term as provided in this section.

<u>E.</u> No member of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall be employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs during the time of his or her service on the Oklahoma Veterans Commission nor shall any person who served as a member of the Oklahoma Veterans Commission be employed by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs subsequent to his or her service on the Commission for a period of two (2) years.

18 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 72 O.S. 2021, Section 63.3, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 Section 63.3. The Oklahoma Veterans Commission shall perform 21 all acts necessary or proper to afford emergency, temporary and 22 permanent relief and assistance to all honorably discharged ex-23 service persons of all wars of the United States of America and to 24 their dependents, and shall perform such other duties as may be

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1 prescribed by law. The Commission shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act, 2 for the operation and maintenance of the Oklahoma Department of 3 Veterans Affairs; provided, however, in all cases priority and 4 5 preference shall always be given to disabled or diseased ex-service The members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for 6 persons. necessary travel as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act. 7 In addition to its other powers and duties as herein provided, the 8 9 Commission shall have the following specific powers and duties which shall, however, not be deemed to be exclusive: 10

11 1. To organize itself by the election of a Chairman <u>chair</u>, Vice 12 Chairman <u>vice chair</u> and Secretary, who shall perform the duties 13 required of them by the rules and regulations, but shall receive no 14 extra compensation therefor, and to provide for the time and place 15 of meetings of the Commission;

2. To appoint the <u>Executive</u> Director of the <u>Oklahoma</u> Department of Veterans Affairs <u>with the advice and consent of the Senate</u> and provide for the employment of all such other personnel as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of Sections 63.1 through 63.4 of this title, and any other duties prescribed by law. The salary and tenure of the <u>Executive</u> Director of the Department shall be determined by the Commission; and

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1	3. To approve all claims or expenditures from such
2	appropriations as may be made to the Commission prior to the payment
3	thereof except as may be otherwise provided by law.
4	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
