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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-1962, as		
18	amended by Section 38, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2022 (63 O.S. Supp. 2023,		
19	Section 1-1962), is amended to read as follows:		
20	A. No home care agency, as that term is defined by the Home		
21	Care Act $_{\underline{\prime}}$ shall operate without first obtaining a license as		
22	required by the Home Care Act.		
23	B. 1. No home care agency, except as otherwise provided by		
24	this subsection, shall place an individual in the role of supportive		
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(Bold face denotes Committee Amendments)

1	home assistant with a client on a full-time, temporary, per diem, or		
2	other basis, unless the individual has completed agency-based		
3	supportive home assistant training taught by a registered nurse in		
4	the sections applicable to the assistance required by the client.		
5	Each supportive home assistant who successfully completes agency-		
6	based training shall demonstrate competence by testing through an		
7	independent entity approved by the State Department of Health. The		
8	requirements related to application, approval, renewal, and denial		
9	of such testing entities shall be set forth in administrative rules		
10	promulgated by the State Commissioner of Health.		
11	2. The home care agency shall develop a written training plan		
12	that shall include, at a minimum, the following:		
13	a. observation, reporting, and documentation of client

14	performed in accordance with Section 1-1950.1 of this title and the
15	assistant is found to have no notations of abuse of any kind on the
16	registry and no convictions of the crimes listed in subsection F of
17	Section 1-1950.1 of this title.
18	5. No home care agency may employ a supportive home assistant
19	listed on the Department of Human Services Community Services Worker
20	Registry.
21	6. No licensed health care facility, licensed physician,

For purposes of 3 this subsection, "licensed health care facility" shall include acute 4 5 care hospitals, long-term acute care hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, 6 residential care homes, home care agencies, adult day care centers 7 and hospice agencies. 8

9 C. 1. No employer or contractor, except as otherwise provided 10 by this subsection, shall employ or contract with any individual as 11 a home health aide for more than four (4) months, on a full-time, 12 temporary, per diem or other basis, unless the individual is a 13 licensed health professional or unless the individual has satisfied 14 the requirements for certification and placement on the home health 15 aide registry maintained by the State Department of Health.

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disabilities; provided, that staff members and individuals providing the services shall receive a level of training, approved by the Department of Human Services, which meets or exceeds the level required pursuant to the Home Care Act. An individual, agency, or organization otherwise covered under the Home Care Act shall be exempt from the act only for those paraprofessional direct care services provided under contracts referenced in this paragraph;

An individual, agency, or organization that provides or 8 9 supports the provision of personal care services to an individual 10 who performs individual employer responsibilities of hiring, training, directing and managing a personal care attendant as part 11 12 of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Consumer-Directed Personal Assistance Supports and Services (CD-PASS) waiver program. 13 An individual, agency, or organization otherwise covered under the 14 provisions of the Home Care Act shall be exempt from the act only 15 for those paraprofessional direct care services provided under 16 Oklahoma Health Care Authority contracts referenced in this 17 paragraph, but shall not be exempt from the criminal history 18 background check required under the Home Care Act and Section 1-19 1950.1 of this title for other paraprofessional direct care service 20 providers. A personal care attendant hired by a consumer under the 21 CD-PASS program shall be exempt from certification as a home health 22 aide, provided such personal care attendant receives the training 23 required and approved by the Department of Human Services; 24
