Supp. 2023, Section 6-10 190.2), which relates to the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund; updating statutory reference; 11 modifying allocation of funding; removing purpose of fund to serve as certain match; providing an 12 effective date; and declaring an emergency. 13 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-190, as 16 amended by Section 3, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023, 17 Section 6-190), is amended to read as follows: 18 Section 6-190. A. The board of education of each school 19 district shall employ and contract in writing, as required in 20 Section 6-101 of this title, only with persons certified to teach by 21 the State Board of Education in accordance with the Oklahoma Teacher 22 Preparation Act, except as otherwise provided for by Section 6-101 23 24 of this title and by other law.

B. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person who:

3 1. Has successfully completed the teacher education program 4 required by the Commission for Educational Quality and 5 Accountability;

6 2. Has graduated from an accredited institution of higher
7 education that has approval or accreditation for teacher education;
8 3. Has met all other requirements as may be established by the
9 Board;

Has made the necessary application and paid the competency
 examination fee in an amount and as prescribed by the Commission;
 Has successfully completed the competency examination
 required in Section 6-187 of this title; and

6. Beginning November 1, 2001, has on file with the Board a 14 current Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State 15 Bureau of Investigation as well as a national criminal history 16 record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 17 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the 18 Statutes. Board may issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective 19 until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history 20 record. The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible 21 for the cost of the criminal history records. 22

23 C. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to any person 24 who:

Holds an out-of-state certificate and meets the requirements
 set forth in subsection G of this section;

3 2. Holds certification from the National Board for Professional
4 Teaching Standards;

5 3. Holds an out-of-country certificate and meets the6 requirements set forth in subsection F of this section; or

4. Has successfully completed a competency examination used in
the majority of other states or comparable customized exam and meets
the requirements set forth in subsection H of this section.

Beginning July 1, 2004, any person applying for initial 10 D. Oklahoma certification shall have on file with the Board a current 11 12 Oklahoma criminal history record from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 13 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 14 Upon receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record, the Board may issue 15 a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of 16 the national fingerprint-based criminal history record. The person 17 applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the 18 criminal history records. 19

E. Any person holding a valid certificate, issued prior to
January 1, 1997, shall be a certified teacher for purposes of the
Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act, subject to any professional
development requirements prescribed by the Oklahoma Teacher
Preparation Act or by the State Board of Education.

F. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-country certificate and meets any requirements established by the Board. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the outof-country certificate.

7 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this
8 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations
9 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the
10 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-country
11 certificate.

12 3. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma 13 criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 14 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 15 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 16 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 17 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt 18 of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 19 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the 20 cost of the criminal history record checks. 21

4. The Board shall promulgate rules establishing a process bywhich out-of-country certificates will be reviewed and evaluated for

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1 purposes of awarding a certificate to teach pursuant to this
2 subsection.

G. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a person who holds a valid out-of-state certificate. The certificate to teach shall only be for those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state certificate.

8 2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 9 subsection shall not be required to take any competency examinations 10 in those subject areas and grade levels most closely aligned to the 11 subject areas and grade levels recognized on the out-of-state 12 certificate.

3. A person who meets the requirements of this subsection shall 13 have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history 14 record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation as well 15 as a national criminal history record check as defined in Section 16 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon receipt of the 17 Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may issue a 18 temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the 19 national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 20 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost 21 of the criminal history record checks. 22

H. 1. The Board shall issue a certificate to teach to a personwho has successfully completed a competency exam used in a majority

of the other states. The certificate to teach shall only be for
 those subject areas and grade levels that correspond with a
 certification area used in Oklahoma.

2. A person who meets the requirements of paragraph 1 of this 4 5 subsection shall have on file with the Board a current Oklahoma criminal history record check from the Oklahoma State Bureau of 6 Investigation as well as a national criminal history record check as 7 defined in Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Upon 8 9 receipt of the Oklahoma criminal history record check, the Board may 10 issue a temporary certificate which shall be effective until receipt of the national fingerprint-based criminal history record check. 11 12 The person applying for a certificate shall be responsible for the cost of the criminal history record checks. 13

The Board may establish new levels of teacher I. 14 1. certificates: advanced, lead, and master. Each level shall have a 15 minimum salary increase requirement paid by the school district and 16 matched with state dollars from the lottery funds as provided in 17 Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. The advanced 18 certificate shall include a minimum salary increase of Three 19 Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), the lead certificate shall include a 20 minimum salary increase of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), and 21 the master certificate shall include a minimum salary increase of 22 Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and maximum salary increase of 23 Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). 24

A teacher who works in a school with an enrollment of forty
 percent (40%) or more of students who are economically disadvantaged
 as defined in Section 18-109.5 of this title or a school district
 with an enrollment of fewer than one thousand students shall be paid
 a one-time award in addition to the salary increases provided in
 paragraph 1 of this subsection:

- 7 a. One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for an
  8 advanced certificate,
- 9 b. Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for a
  10 lead certificate, and
- 11 c. Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a master 12 certificate.

3. School districts may identify and designate the highest 13 quality teachers for advanced, lead, and master certificates. 14 Participating districts shall submit designation plans to the State 15 Department of Education for evaluation and approval. Districts 16 17 shall have local control and flexibility in determining how to evaluate teachers and assign designations, but, at a minimum, the 18 designation system shall include a teacher observation, out-of-19 classroom time, and a student performance component. 20

a. Teacher observation shall be based on the district's
 selected <u>Oklahoma</u> Teacher and Leader Effectiveness
 Evaluation System (TLE) evaluation tool or an
 alternate method of evaluation; provided, the method

is evidenced-based. Alternate methods of evaluation
 shall not replace the requirements of Section 6-101.16
 of this title.

- Each school district that elects to participate in 4 b. 5 assigning advanced, lead, and master teacher certificates shall include an out-of-classroom 6 component for its assigned teachers to allow for 7 professional growth opportunities while staying in the 8 9 classroom. How out-of-classroom time is allotted and 10 managed shall be determined by the school district and submitted as part of its designation plan to the State 11 12 Department of Education for review and approval.
- c. Student performance measures may be determined by the
   district and may include, but shall not be limited to,
   pre- and post-tests, summative or formative, and
   portfolios. The school district application shall
   show evidence of validity and reliability of the
   measures.

Districts may use additional factors in determining which teachers are eligible to receive a designation, such as student surveys, teacher leadership responsibilities, teacher mentorship responsibilities, family surveys, demonstration of district core values, teacher peer surveys, and contributions to the broader school community. No more than ten percent (10%) of each school

1 district's teachers may be designated as an advanced, lead, or 2 master teacher in any given school year.

4. If a school district chooses to participate in this program,
the state shall match the amount the district pays provide the
increased salary amounts indicated for advanced, lead, and master
certificates in paragraph 1 of this subsection above the base pay,
up to Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) per teacher.

8 5. School districts that designate teachers for advanced, lead,
9 and master certificates do not have to participate in annual TLE
10 evaluations for the designated teachers.

6. School districts may designate teachers for advanced, lead, or master certificates two times per year, once prior to the beginning of the school year, and once prior to the beginning of the second semester. Teachers statewide who receive these designations shall be placed in professional development cohorts and provided additional training opportunities from the State Department of Education.

7. After initial approval by the State Department of Education,
the Department shall review and validate each participating school
district's teacher evaluation system biennially.

8. The State Department of Education shall annually report the school districts participating in the program, the number of advanced, lead, and master certificates awarded, and the total amount in state match funding that was distributed to teachers from

1 <u>the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund created in Section 6-190.2 of</u> 2 this title.

3 <u>9. The selection criteria; designation of advanced, lead, or</u>
4 <u>master teachers; and any associated salary increases shall not be</u>
5 subject to collective bargaining.

J. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement a renewal schedule and associated fees for advanced, lead, and master teaching certificates. The rules shall allow a teacher that no longer meets the requirements of an advanced, lead, or master teaching certificate to make application for the standard teaching certificate.

12 K. The terms of the contracts issued to those holding advanced,13 lead, and master teaching certificates shall include the following:

1. Advanced: an additional five (5) days to be used to 14 strengthen instructional leadership. A person with an advanced 15 teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary increase of at 16 least Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or the district's daily 17 rate of pay, whichever is higher, in addition to the salary for 18 which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 Section 19 18-114.15 of this title. This increase shall be matched funded by 20 state dollars from the lottery funds as provided in Section 713 of 21 Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be paid as regular 22 annual compensation directly to teachers through school districts; 23

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1 2. Lead: an additional ten (10) days to be used to strengthen 2 instructional leadership. A person with a lead teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary increase of at least Five Thousand 3 Dollars (\$5,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever 4 5 is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies pursuant to Section 18-114.14 Section 18-114.15 of this title. This 6 increase shall be matched funded by state dollars from the lottery 7 funds as provided in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma 8 9 Statutes and shall be paid as regular annual compensation directly 10 to teachers through school districts; and

3. Master: an additional fifteen (15) days to be used to 11 12 strengthen leadership. A person with a master teaching certificate shall receive an annual salary increase of at least Ten Thousand 13 Dollars (\$10,000.00) or the district's daily rate of pay, whichever 14 is higher, in addition to the salary for which the teacher qualifies 15 pursuant to Section 18-114.14 Section 18-114.15 of this title. 16 This increase, up to Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), shall be 17 matched funded by state dollars from the lottery funds as provided 18 in Section 713 of Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes and shall be 19 paid as regular annual compensation directly to teachers through 20 school districts. 21

If a person with an advanced, lead, or master teaching certificate changes school districts during the life of the

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certificate, the terms of the contracts required in this subsection
 shall be subject to approval by the new employing school district.

L. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the Department shall make the teaching certificates provided for in this section available for any person who has received a recommendation from his or her school district and who meets the eligibility criteria as outlined in each school district's teacher evaluation system provided for in subsection I of this section.

9 M. The funding necessary for the administration of this section 10 shall be provided from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund 11 created in <u>Section 2</u> <u>Section 6-190.2</u> of this <u>act title</u>. If funding 12 for the administration of the teaching certificates listed in 13 subsection I is not available, the Department shall not be required 14 to fulfill the requirements listed in subsections I, K, and L of 15 this section.

N. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of Section 6-180 et seq. of this title. SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 359, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-190.2), is amended to read as follows:

21 Section 6-190.2. A. There is hereby created in the State 22 Treasury a revolving fund for the State Department of Education to 23 be designated the "Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund". The 24 revolving fund shall be a continuing fund, without legislative

appropriation, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall be
under the control and management of the State Department of
Education. Expenditures from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund
shall be budgeted and expended as provided for in subsection B of
this section.

The State Department of Education shall utilize the funds 6 в. for the program outlined in Section 6-190 of Title 70 of the 7 Oklahoma Statutes this title. Funding shall go toward advanced, 8 9 lead, and master certificate holders be allocated to school 10 districts to provide the increased salary amounts indicated for 11 advanced, lead, and master certificates as provided for in 12 subsection I of Section 6-190 of this title on a first-come, firstserved basis until the cash is exhausted for the school year. Funds 13 from the Teacher Empowerment Revolving Fund shall serve as a state 14 match to local dollars each school district contributes to its 15 advanced, lead, and master teachers as provided in Section 713 of 16 Title 3A of the Oklahoma Statutes. 17 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024. 18 SECTION 4.
