Violation of this subsection shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by not more than one (1) year of imprisonment in the county jail or by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - 2. A person who commits a second or subsequent violation of this subsection shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of

 Corrections for not more than one (1) year in the county jail two

 (2) years or by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars

 (\$500.00) One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Five

 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or by both such fine and imprisonment.
 - B. Any person who violates the provisions of subsection A of this section in such manner as to endanger any other person shall be deemed guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the State Penitentiary custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not less than one (1) year three (3) years nor more than five (5) years, or by a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
