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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 6001, as
16	amended by Section 1, Chapter 128, O.S.L. 2022 (59 O.S. Supp. 2022,
17	Section 6001), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 6001. A. 1. There is hereby re-created the State
19	Board of Behavioral Health Licensure to continue until July 1, 2023
20	2026, in accordance with the provisions of the Oklahoma Sunset Law.
21	2. Members of the Board shall serve at the pleasure of and may
22	be removed from office by the appointing authority. Members shall
23	continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any vacancy
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1 shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. 2 Four members shall constitute a quorum. 3. The Board shall meet at least twice a year, but no more than 3 four (4) times a year and shall elect a chair and a vice-chair vice 4 5 chair from among its members. The Board shall only meet as required for: 6 election of officers, 7 a. b. establishment of meeting dates and times, 8 9 с. rule development, d. review and recommendation, and 10 adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the Board 11 e. 12 concerning matters brought before the Board. Special meetings may be called by the chair or by 13 4. concurrence of any three members. 14 1. All members of the Board shall be knowledgeable of 15 Β. counseling issues. The Board shall be appointed by the Governor 16 with the advice and consent of the Senate: 17 four members who are licensed professional counselors, 18 a. three members who are licensed family and marital b. 19 therapists, 20 с. two members who are licensed behavioral practitioners, 21 and 22 two members representing the public and possessing d. 23 knowledge of counseling issues. 24

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2. Members of the Board shall serve for a period of three (3)
 years and may be removed at any time by the appointing authority.
 Vacancies on the Board shall be filled by the appointing authority.
 A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the
 transaction of business.

The members of the Board from each professional area of 6 3. behavioral health counseling shall comprise separate committees and 7 shall consult on professional issues within their respective areas 8 9 of behavioral health counseling. Each committee shall recommend to 10 the Board approval or disapproval of all licenses to be issued within its specialty. Each committee shall be authorized to 11 12 recommend approval or disapproval of the examination requirements for all applicants for licensure in the respective area of 13 behavioral health counseling, provide grading standards for 14 examinations, and provide for other matters relating to licensure in 15 that area of behavioral health counseling. Each committee may 16 create advisory committees to consult on professional duties and 17 responsibilities pursuant to the provisions of this section. 18

Any and all recommendations, approvals, or disapprovals made
 by a committee pursuant to the provisions of this section shall not
 become effective without the approval of a majority of members of
 the Board.

5. The jurisdictional areas of the Board shall includeprofessional counseling licensing and practice issues, marital and

family therapist licensing and practice issues, behavioral
 practitioner licensing and practice issues and such other areas as
 authorized by the Licensed Professional Counselors Act.

C. The Board shall not recommend rules for promulgation unless
all applicable requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act
have been followed including but not limited to notice, rule impact
statements and rule-making hearings.

D. Members of the Board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act. The Board is authorized to utilize the conference rooms of and obtain administrative assistance from the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as required.

14 E. The Board is authorized and empowered to:

Establish and maintain a system of licensure and
 certification pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed
 Professional Counselors Act;

Adopt and enforce standards governing the professional
 conduct of persons licensed pursuant to the provisions of the
 Licensed Professional Counselors Act;

3. Lease office space for the purpose of operating and
 maintaining a state office, and pay rent thereon; provided, however,
 such state office shall not be located in or directly adjacent to

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1 the office of any person licensed pursuant to the provisions of the 2 Licensed Professional Counselors Act;

3 4. Purchase office furniture, equipment, and supplies;
4 5. Employ such office personnel as may be necessary, and fix
5 and pay their salaries or wages;

6 6. Contract with state agencies for the purposes of
7 investigating written complaints regarding the conduct of persons
8 licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Licensed Professional
9 Counselors Act and obtaining administrative assistance as deemed
10 necessary by the Executive Director; and

11 7. Make such other expenditures as may be necessary in the 12 performance of its duties.

F. The Board shall employ an Executive Director. The ExecutiveDirector shall be authorized to:

15 1. Employ and maintain an office staff;

16 2. Enter into contracts on behalf of the Board; and

17 3. Perform other duties on behalf of the Board as needed or18 directed.

G. All employees and positions shall be placed in unclassified
status, exempt from the provisions of the Oklahoma Personnel Act.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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1	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
