SENATE BILL 1806

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to substance abuse services; defining term; providing certain power and duty to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; requiring certain state agencies to execute certain interagency agreements; requiring certain submission of data by state agencies and political subdivisions; requiring the Department to compile and submit certain annual report; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-402 of Title 43A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. As used in this section, "emergency opioid antagonist" means a drug including but not limited to naloxone that blocks the effects of opioids and that is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of an opioid overdose.

B. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall have the power and duty to coordinate and oversee the distribution of emergency opioid antagonists by state agencies.

1 C. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid
2 antagonists, including but not limited to the State Department of
3 Health, shall execute an interagency agreement with the Department
4 of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to coordinate the
5 distribution of emergency opioid antagonists.

6 D. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid
7 antagonists, or any political subdivision that receives an opioid
8 grant award under the Political Subdivisions Opioid Abatement Grants
9 Act to purchase emergency opioid antagonists for distribution, shall
10 submit data to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
11 Services on the agency's or political subdivision's distribution of
12 emergency opioid antagonists including geographic data, data on the
13 entities receiving emergency opioid antagonists from the agency, and
14 any other data requested by the Department of Mental Health and
15 Substance Abuse Services.

16 E. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services
17 shall compile an annual report summarizing and analyzing the data
18 submitted by state agencies and political subdivisions under
19 subsection D of this section and its own data on distribution of
20 emergency opioid antagonists during the prior state fiscal year and
21 shall, beginning December 1, 2025, electronically submit the report
22 to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House
23 of Representatives, and the Governor no later than December 1 of
24 each year.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.

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
