C. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid antagonists, including but not limited to the State Department of Health, shall execute an interagency agreement with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to coordinate the distribution of emergency opioid antagonists.

- D. Any state agency that distributes emergency opioid antagonists, or any political subdivision that receives an opioid grant award under the Political Subdivisions Opioid Abatement Grants Act to purchase emergency opioid antagonists for distribution, shall submit data to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services on the agency's or political subdivision's distribution of emergency opioid antagonists including geographic data, data on the entities receiving emergency opioid antagonists from the agency, and any other data requested by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.
- E. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall compile an annual report summarizing and analyzing the data submitted by state agencies and political subdivisions under subsection D of this section and its own data on distribution of emergency opioid antagonists during the prior state fiscal year and shall, beginning December 1, 2025, electronically submit the report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Governor no later than December 1 of each year.
