7	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Advisory Council on
8	Indian Education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3- 173, which relates to composition and duties of the
9	Council; recreating the council until certain date; modifying appointment authority for certain members;
10	modifying date by which appointments are to be made; providing for the filling of certain vacancies;
11	updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-173, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 3-173. A. There is hereby re-created to continue until
18	July 1, 2023 July 1, 2026, in accordance with the provisions of the
19	Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian
20	Education.
21	B. The Council shall:
22	1. Make recommendations to the State Board of Education and the
23	Superintendent of Public Instruction in educational matters
24 27	affecting the education of Native American students;

1 2. Promote educational opportunities and improvement of the 2 quality of education provided to Native American students throughout 3 the state;

Advocate for Native American students in the state; and
Monitor and evaluate how the public education system of the
state impacts Native American students.

7 C. The Council shall be composed of eighteen (18) members as 8 follows:

9 1. Five members who shall each represent an Indian tribe in the 10 state, of which at least one shall represent an Indian tribe which 11 has an enrollment of less than ten thousand (10,000) members who 12 reside in the state, appointed by the Governor Speaker of the House 13 of Representatives from a list of nominations submitted by the 14 elected executive leaders of different Indian tribes in the state; 15 2. Four members who shall each represent the tribal education 16 departments of an Indian tribe in the state, appointed by the 17 Governor President Pro Tempore of the Senate from a list of 18 nominations submitted by the elected executive leaders of different

19 Indian tribes in the state;

20 3. One member who shall represent the Oklahoma Council on <u>for</u>
 21 Indian Education, appointed by the Governor;

4. Two members who shall represent two different statewide organizations representing public school teachers, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

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5. One member who shall represent a statewide organization representing public school superintendents, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

6. One member who shall represent Oklahoma tribal colleges,
appointed by the Chancellor of Higher Education;

6 7. The Director of the Native American Cultural and Educational 7 Authority, or designee;

8. The Chancellor of Higher Education, or designee;

9 9. The Director of the Oklahoma Department of Career and
10 Technology Education, or designee; and

10. The Superintendent of Public Instruction, or designee.

12 D. Appointments to the Council shall be made by September 1, 13 The first meeting of the Council shall be called by the 2010 2023. 14 Superintendent of Public Instruction. At the first meeting, the 15 members of the Council shall elect a chair and vice-chair vice chair 16 from among the members. Meetings of the Council shall be held at 17 least quarterly at the call of the chair. Members shall serve at 18 the pleasure of their appointing authorities. A majority of the 19 members of the Council shall constitute a quorum to transact 20 business, but no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining 21 members to exercise all of the powers of the Council. A vacancy on 22 the Council shall be filled by the original appointing authority. A 23 vacancy on the Council in a seat representing an Indian tribe in the 24 state or the tribal education department of an Indian tribe in the _ _

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1 state shall be filled by the original appointing authority from a 2 list of nominations submitted by the elected executive leaders of 3 Indian tribes in the state. Appointments to fill any vacancy on the 4 Council shall be made within three (3) months following the vacancy. 5 The State Department of Education, Oklahoma Department of Career and 6 Technology Education, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 7 Education shall provide staff, support, and information as requested 8 by the Council.

9 E. Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for 10 serving on the Council_r but shall receive travel reimbursement as 11 follows:

12 1. State employees who are members of the Council shall be 13 reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their 14 duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State 15 Travel Reimbursement Act; and

2. All other members of the Council shall be reimbursed by the
 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for travel expenses
 incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the
 State Travel Reimbursement Act.

F. The Council shall act in accordance with the provisions of
 the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

G. Members who serve on the Council shall be exempt from the dual-office-holding prohibitions of Section 6 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

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H. The Council shall have the following duties:

Identify strategies for developing an efficient and reliable
 process of communications between Oklahoma education entities,
 educators, tribal organizations, and other interested parties;

5 2. Identify and disseminate research-based, measurable 6 criteria, both behavioral and academic, by which the success and 7 efficacy of the education offered to Native American students in 8 Oklahoma may be measured;

9 3. Analyze data to ensure that education agencies in Oklahoma
 10 continue to address the education needs of Native American students;

11 4. Encourage and promote Native American educational leadership 12 at all levels of the education system; and

13 5. Make recommendations to the State Board of Education for 14 programs that will help achieve the purposes of the Oklahoma 15 Advisory Council on Indian Education Act.

16 I. The Council shall evaluate and make an annual report on the 17 effectiveness of the public education system in Oklahoma in meeting 18 the needs of Native American students in Oklahoma. The report shall 19 be submitted to the State Board of Education. The report shall also 20 contain a summary of the findings made by the Council pursuant to 21 subsection H of this section, a summary of all data collected by the 22 Council, a summary of the means by which all data was collected by 23 the Council, and any other information deemed necessary by the 24 Council. _ _

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1	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
2	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
4	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
