SENATE BILL 33

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health; prohibiting public entities and contractors from requiring COVID-19 vaccinations or discriminating due to vaccination status; defining term; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-502.5 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any federal or state agency, any political subdivision, or any business under contract with a federal or state agency or political subdivision to require any resident of this state to submit to or receive a COVID-19 vaccination or any variant thereof. Additionally, no federal or state agency, political subdivision, or business under contract with a federal or state agency or political subdivision shall discriminate against any resident of this state due to vaccination status. As used in this section, "political subdivision" means a county, city, town, school

1 district, or other governmental or public entity located within this

3 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
4 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby  
5 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
6 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
