7	An Act relating to motorcycle profiling; requiring
8	local law enforcement agencies to adopt policy, review training, and address issues pertaining to

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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 15-133 of Title 47, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. For the purpose of this section, "motorcycle profiling"
17	means the discriminatory use of the fact that a person rides a
18	motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as a factor in
19	deciding to stop and question, take enforcement action, arrest, or
20	search a person or vehicle with or without a legal basis under the
21	United States Constitution or Oklahoma Constitution.
22	B. Every law enforcement agency in this state shall be required
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1	1. Adopt a written policy designed to condemn and prevent
2	motorcycle profiling;
3	2. Review and audit existing procedures, practices, and
4	training;
5	3. Institute training to address issues related to motorcycle
6	profiling; and
7	4. Work with motorcycle groups in their communities to
8	appropriately address the issue of motorcycle profiling.
9	C. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training shall
10	ensure that issues related to motorcycle profiling are addressed in
11	basic law enforcement training and offered in regional training for
12	in-service law enforcement officers at all levels.
13	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
