8	AS INTRODUCED
9	A Concurrent Resolution encouraging further economic
10	ties and friendship between the State of Oklahoma and Taiwan; and directing distribution.
11	
12	WHEREAS, the longstanding bonds of friendship, economic ties,
13	and bonds of friendship between the United States and Taiwan,
14	embodied in the Taiwan Relations Act, continue to yield important
15	economic, social, strategic, and cultural benefits; and
16	WHEREAS, Taiwan ranks as the United States' eighth-largest
17	trading partner with bilateral trade reaching \$166 billion, the
18	thirteenth-largest goods export market of the United States, and the
19	sixth-largest export market for United States agricultural products;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, the robust United States-Taiwan trade and investment
22	
23	partnership provides a solid foundation for a mutually beneficial
24	bilateral trade agreement to spur job creation, expand the global
24 د ٦	market, and secure international supply chains; and

<sup>1</sup> WHEREAS, Taiwan is committed to helping address global <sup>2</sup> challenges, from humanitarian crises to nontraditional security <sup>3</sup> threats and pandemic prevention; and

WHEREAS, Taiwanese officials and civil society groups partner
with the United States on a range of issues to promote shared values
of freedom, democracy, and human rights; and

7 WHEREAS, since 1980, Oklahoma and Taiwan have maintained a 8 sister-state relationship and enjoy particularly close economic 9 ties; Taiwan is Oklahoma's tenth-largest export partner in Asia with 10 over \$37 million in goods and services exported to Taiwan in 2023; 11 and the establishment of an Oklahoma Trade and Investment Office in 12 Taiwan could enhance the participation of small- and medium-sized 13 enterprises in trade and investment; and

<sup>14</sup> WHEREAS, given the important role Taiwan plays in global <sup>15</sup> aviation security, Taiwan's participation in the International Civil <sup>16</sup> Aviation Organization (ICAO) would help develop a global aviation <sup>17</sup> safety network and address vital issues such as the unilateral <sup>18</sup> adjustment of flight routes in the Taiwan Strait like the M503; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma and the United States have benefited immeasurably through decades of unwavering friendship with Taiwan, and the wider world is sure to reap tremendous rewards as Taiwan works to enhance its presence in the international community.
