L 6	he helped originate and popularize a unique genre of music rooted in
L7	folk, jazz, and blues that would lead to the development of rock and
L8	roll and modern country music; and
L 9	WHEREAS, Bob Wills entertained millions of people during his
20	heyday, performing twice weekly at what would become the historic
21	Cain's Ballroom in Tulsa, playing live daily radio broadcasts,
22	touring across the country, and appearing in more than a dozen
