8	conditions and burning prohibitions; changing the required conditions for an extreme fire danger;
9	changing requirements for county commissioners to declare a burn ban; and declaring an emergency.

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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 2 O.S. 2021, Section 16-26, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 16-26. A. 1. It is unlawful for any person to set
16	fire to any forest, grass, range, crop, or other wildlands, or to
17	build a campfire or bonfire, or to burn trash or other material that
18	may cause a forest, grass, range, crop or other wildlands fire in
19	any county, counties or area within a county where, because of
20	emergency drought conditions, there is gubernatorially proclaimed
21	extraordinary danger from fire, unless the setting of any backfire
22	during the drought emergency is necessary to afford protection as
23	determined by a representative of the Division of Forestry, or
24	unless it can be established that the setting of the backfire was

necessary for the purpose of saving life or property. The burden of
 proving the necessity shall rest on the person claiming a defense.

2. The Division of Forestry shall advise the Governor when the
lands described in paragraph 1 of this subsection in any county,
counties or area within a county of this state because of emergency
drought conditions are in extraordinary danger from fire. The
Governor may by proclamation declare a drought emergency to exist
and describe the general boundaries of the area affected.

9 3. Any proclamation promulgated by the Governor under authority of this subsection shall be effective immediately upon the 10 11 Governor's signed approval of the emergency proclamation and shall supersede any resolution passed by a board of county commissioners 12 13 pursuant to subsection B of this section. Notice of the 14 proclamation shall occur through posting on the Oklahoma Department 15 of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry's website and informing local 16 news media. Evidence of publication or posting as herein provided 17 shall be maintained by the Forestry Division.

4. When conditions warrant, due notice of the termination of
the emergency shall be promptly made by proclamation, which shall be
published or posted in like manner as when officially declared.

5. Any person who violates this subsection is guilty of a
misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00), by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year,
or both.

1 B. 1. It is unlawful for any person to set fire to any forest, 2 grass, range, crop or other wildlands, or to build a campfire or bonfire, or to burn trash or other material that may cause a forest, 3 grass, range, crop or other wildlands fire in any county of this 4 5 state in which the board of county commissioners of the county has passed a resolution declaring a period of extreme fire danger. As 6 7 used in this subsection, "extreme fire danger" means: all three out of four of the following conditions are 8 a. 9 present: severe, extreme, or exceptional drought 10 (1)11 conditions exist as determined by the National 12 Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) 13 pursuant to its criteria, 14 (2) no more than one-half (1/2) inch of precipitation 15 is forecast for the next three (3) days, and 16 either of the following: (3) 17 (a) fire occurrence is significantly greater 18 than normal for the season and/or initial 19 attack on a significant number of wildland 20 fires has been unsuccessful due to extreme 21 fire behavior, or 22 (b) where data is available, more than twenty 23 percent (20%) of the wildfires in the county 24 have been caused by escaped debris or

1	controlled burning, or a portion of the
2	county has a Keetch-Bryam Drought Index
3	(KBDI) rating of 600 or higher, and
4	b.
5	(4) temperatures for any day over the next three (3)
6	days are forecasted at or over one hundred (100)
7	degrees Fahrenheit.
8	2. A majority of the board of county commissioners may call an
9	emergency meeting at any time to pass or revoke a resolution
10	declaring a period of extreme fire danger in accordance with this
11	section.
12	3. A board of county commissioners shall have <u>may pass a</u>
13	resolution declaring a period of extreme fire danger in the county
14	either with the documented concurrence of a majority of the chiefs,
15	or their designees, of the municipal and certified rural fire
16	departments located in the county that a period of extreme fire
17	danger exists prior to passage of a resolution declaring a period of
18	extreme fire danger in the county or when the Keetch-Bryam Drought
19	Index (KBDI) is 600 or higher, which indicates extreme fire danger.
20	The resolution shall be effective for a period not to exceed
21	fourteen (14) days from the date of passage by the board of county
22	commissioners, unless the burn ban is removed earlier by the same
23	method by which it was approved. If extreme fire danger conditions
24	persist, subsequent resolutions may be passed by the board of county

commissioners in the same manner as provided in this paragraph. The
 board of county commissioners, in the resolution, may grant
 exceptions to the fire prohibition based on appropriate
 precautionary measures.

4. Agricultural producers burning cropland, rangeland, forests
or pastures as a preferred method of managing their property shall
be exempt from any resolution passed by a board of county
commissioners that declares a period of extreme fire danger so long
as the agricultural producers have complied with the following
procedures:

- 11 submit a written prescribed burn plan to the local a. 12 fire department and, if within a protection area, the 13 local office or local representative of the Forestry 14 Division of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, 15 Food, and Forestry nearest the land to be burned that 16 shall include the following information: 17 (1)the name and telephone number of the agricultural 18 producer conducting the burn,
- 19 (2) the address and legal description of the area to20 be burned,
- 21 (3) the objective and purpose of the burn,
- (4) a list of fire departments and sheriff's offices
 that are required to be notified pursuant to
 subparagraph c of this paragraph,

1	(5) a list of adjoining landowners required to be
2	notified pursuant to Section 16-28.2 of this
3	title,
4	(6) a description of any firebreaks used to define
5	the boundary of the prescribed burn,
6	(7) a statement of prescribed weather conditions,
7	(8) a description of any smoke-management
8	considerations, and
9	(9) an ignition plan for the burn,
10	b. keep a copy of the written prescribed burn plan
11	provided for in subparagraph a of this paragraph on
12	site when conducting the prescribed burn,
13	c. notify the county sheriff and the dispatch center of
14	the local fire department prior to conducting the
15	prescribed burn, and
16	d. comply with the notification procedures outlined in
17	Section 16-28.2 of this title.
18	5. The prescribed burn plan provided for in paragraph 4 of this
19	subsection shall be deemed approved seventy-two (72) hours after
20	submission to the local fire department; provided, that the local
21	fire department may amend the submitted burn plan within seventy-two
22	(72) hours after submission.
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6. The prescribed burn plan provided for in paragraph 4 of this
 subsection shall not include campfires, household trash, debris or
 pile burning.

7. Nothing in paragraph 4 of this subsection shall supersede
requirements set by a proclamation promulgated by the Governor under
authority of this section, interfere with the authority of the
Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to enforce
burning laws or change the burner's liability as prescribed by law.

9 8. Any resolution passed by a board of county commissioners under authority of this subsection shall be effective immediately 10 11 upon passage of the resolution. Notice of the resolution shall be submitted to the Forestry Division of the Oklahoma Department of 12 13 Agriculture, Food, and Forestry, all local news media, local law 14 enforcement officials, and the state headquarters of the Department 15 of Public Safety, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department and 16 the Department of Wildlife Conservation on the day of passage of the 17 resolution. Evidence of publication or posting as provided in this 18 paragraph shall be maintained by the county.

9. The provisions of this subsection may be enforced by any law
 enforcement officer of this state.

21 10. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this
22 subsection shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to
23 a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), to

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1	imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or to both such fine
2	and imprisonment.
3	11. The selling of fireworks shall not be considered an act in
4	violation of this subsection.
5	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
