6	<u>AS INTRODUCED</u>
7	An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105, as amended by Section 42,
8	Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-105), which relates to farm vehicle special
9	permits; deleting certain special permit; allowing individuals of a certain age to make application for
10	a farm permit; authorizing operation of certain vehicles; specifying scenarios when permit may be
11	used for permit holders of a certain age; providing requirements for farm permit issuance; providing
12	restrictions for permit holders of a certain age; prohibiting use of certain device while driving;
13	providing exception; defining term; providing for suspension and revocation of permit; requiring
14	certain affidavit; stating content requirements for affidavit; disallowing the admissibility of certain
15	evidence; providing violations resulting in license restrictions; and declaring an emergency.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105, as
21	amended by Section 42, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
22	Section 6-105), is amended to read as follows:
23	Section 6-105. A. Unless a legal custodial parent or legal
24	guardian has filed an objection to licensure pursuant to Section 6-

1 103.1 of this title, any person under eighteen (18) years of age who
2 is in compliance with or not subject to Section 6-107.3 of this
3 title may be permitted to operate:

A Class D motor vehicle under the graduated driver license
 provisions prescribed in subsections B through E of this section;

6 2. A motorcycle under the provisions prescribed in subsection H7 of this section; or

8 3. A farm vehicle under the provisions prescribed in subsection9 I of this section.

B. Any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age may drive during a session in which the driver is being instructed in a driver education course, as set out in subparagraphs a, b, c, d and e of paragraph 1 of subsection C of this section, by a certified driver education instructor who is seated in the right front seat of the motor vehicle.

16 C. Any person:

Who is at least fifteen and one-half (15 1/2) years of age
 and is currently receiving instruction in or has successfully
 completed driver education. For purposes of this section, the term
 "driver education" shall mean:

a. a prescribed secondary school driver education course,
as provided for in Sections 19-113 through 19-121 of
Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes,

- b. a driver education course, certified by the Department
 of Public Safety, from a parochial, private, or other
 nonpublic secondary school,
- 4 c. a commercial driver training course, as defined by
 5 Sections 801 through 808 of this title,
- d. a parent-taught driver education course, certified by
 the Department of Public Safety. The Department shall
 promulgate rules for any parent-taught driver
 education course, or
- 10 e. a driver education course certified by a state other11 than Oklahoma; or

12 2. Who is at least sixteen (16) years of age,

13 may, upon successfully passing all parts of the driver license 14 examination administered by Service Oklahoma, or an approved written 15 examination proctor, except the driving examination, be issued a 16 learner permit which will grant the permittee the privilege to 17 operate a Class D motor vehicle upon the public highways only 18 between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. and while accompanied 19 by a licensed driver who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age 20 and who is actually occupying a seat beside the permittee; provided, 21 the written examination for a learner permit may be waived by 22 Service Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 23 completed driver education.

D. 1. Any person:

1 who has applied for, been issued, and has possessed a a. 2 learner permit for a minimum of six (6) months, and b. whose custodial legal parent or legal guardian 3 certifies to Service Oklahoma by sworn affidavit that 4 5 the person has received a minimum of fifty (50) hours of actual behind-the-wheel training, of which at least 6 7 ten (10) hours of such training was at night, from a licensed driver who was at least twenty-one (21) years 8 9 of age and who was properly licensed to operate a 10 Class D motor vehicle for a minimum of two (2) years, 11 may be issued an intermediate Class D license upon successfully 12 passing all parts of the driver license examinations administered by 13 Service Oklahoma; provided, the written examination, if it has not 14 previously been administered or waived, may be waived by Service 15 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully 16 completed driver education or the driving examination may be waived 17 by Service Oklahoma upon successful passage of the examination 18 administered by a certified designated examiner, as provided for in Section 6-110 of this title. However, notwithstanding the date of 19 20 issuance of the learner permit, if the person has been convicted of 21 a traffic offense which is reported on the driving record of that 22 person, the time period specified in subparagraph a of this 23 paragraph shall be recalculated to begin from the date of conviction 24 for the traffic offense, and must elapse before that person may be

1 issued an intermediate Class D license. If the person has been 2 convicted of more than one traffic offense which is reported on the driving record of that person, the time period specified in 3 4 subparagraph a of this paragraph shall be recalculated to begin from 5 the most recent date of conviction, and must elapse before that person may be issued an intermediate Class D license. 6 7 2. A person who has been issued an intermediate Class D license 8 under the provisions of this subsection: 9 a. shall be granted the privilege to operate a Class D 10 motor vehicle upon the public highways: 11 only between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 (1)12 p.m., except for driving to and from work, 13 school, school activities, and church activities, 14 or 15 (2)at any time, if a licensed driver who is at least 16 twenty-one (21) years of age is actually 17 occupying a seat beside the intermediate Class D 18 licensee, or if the intermediate Class D licensee 19 is a farm or ranch resident, and is operating a 20 motor vehicle while engaged in farming or 21 ranching operations outside the limits of a 22 municipality, or driving to and from work, 23 school, school activities, or church activities, 24 and

- b. shall not operate a motor vehicle with more than one
 passenger unless:
 - (1) all passengers live in the same household as the custodial legal parent or legal guardian, or
 - (2) a licensed driver at least twenty-one (21) years of age is actually occupying a seat beside the intermediate Class D licensee.

8 E. Any person who has been issued an intermediate Class D
9 license for a minimum of:

10 1. One (1) year; or

11 2. Six (6) months, if the person has completed both the driver 12 education and the parent-certified behind-the-wheel training 13 provisions of subparagraph b of paragraph 1 of subsection D of this 14 section,

may be issued a Class D license. However, notwithstanding the date 15 16 of issuance of the Class D license, if the person has been convicted 17 of a traffic offense which is reported on the driving record of that 18 person, the time periods specified in paragraph 1 or 2 of this 19 subsection, as applicable, shall be recalculated to begin from the 20 date of conviction for the traffic offense, and must elapse before 21 that person may be issued a Class D license. If the person has been 22 convicted of more than one traffic offense which is reported on the 23 driving record of that person, the time periods specified in 24 paragraph 1 or 2 of this subsection, as applicable, shall be

recalculated to begin from the most recent date of conviction, and
 must elapse before that person may be issued a Class D license.

Learner permits and intermediate Class D licenses shall be 3 F. 4 issued for the same period as all other driver licenses. The 5 licenses may be suspended or canceled at the discretion of the Department for violation of restrictions, for failing to give the 6 7 required or correct information on the application, for knowingly giving false or inaccurate information on the application or any 8 9 subsequent documentation related to the granting of driving 10 privileges, for using a hand-held electronic device while operating 11 a motor vehicle for non-life-threatening emergency purposes or for 12 violation of any traffic laws of this state pertaining to the 13 operation of a motor vehicle.

G. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules establishing procedures for removal of learner permit and intermediate Class D license restrictions from the permit or license upon the permittee or licensee qualifying for a less restricted or an unrestricted license.

H. Any person fourteen (14) years of age or older may apply for a restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only restriction. After the person has successfully passed all parts of the motorcycle examination other than the driving examination, has successfully completed a certified state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the Department of Public Safety, in conjunction with

Service Oklahoma, and has met all requirements provided for in the rules of the Department and Service Oklahoma, Service Oklahoma shall issue to the person a restricted Class D license with a motorcycleonly restriction which shall grant to the person, while having the license in the person's immediate possession, the privilege to operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle:

7 1. With a piston displacement not to exceed three hundred (300)
8 cubic centimeters;

9 2. Between the hours of 4:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. only;

10 3. While wearing approved protective headgear; and

4. While accompanied by and receiving instruction from any person who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is properly licensed pursuant to the laws of this state to operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle, and who has visual contact with the restricted licensee.

The restricted licensee may apply on or after thirty (30) days from date of issuance of the restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only restriction to have the restriction of being accompanied by a licensed driver removed by successfully completing the driving portion of an examination.

The written examination and driving examination for a restricted Class D license with a motorcycle-only endorsement shall be waived by Service Oklahoma upon verification that the person has

successfully completed a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
 rider course approved by the Department and Service Oklahoma.

I. Service Oklahoma may in its discretion issue a special 3 4 permit to any person who has attained the age of fourteen (14) 5 years, authorizing such person to operate farm vehicles between the 6 farm and the market to haul commodities grown on the farm; provided, 7 that the special permit shall be temporary and shall expire not more than thirty (30) days after the issuance of the special permit. 8 9 Special permits shall be issued only to farm residents and shall be 10 issued only during the time of the harvest of the principal crops grown on such farm. Provided, however, Service Oklahoma shall not 11 12 issue a special permit pursuant to this subsection until Service 13 Oklahoma is fully satisfied after the examination of the application 14 and other evidence furnished in support thereof, that the person is 15 physically and mentally developed to such a degree that the 16 operation of a motor vehicle by the person would not be inimical to 17 public safety. 18 1. Any person who is less than seventeen (17) years of age but 19 is at least fourteen (14) years of age and who resides upon a farm 20 in this state or is employed for compensation upon a farm in this 21 state may apply to Service Oklahoma for a farm permit authorizing 22 such person, while possessing the permit, to operate any Class D 23 motor vehicle.

21		<u>enti</u>	tle the licensee who is at least sixteen (16)
22		year	s of age to operate the appropriate motor vehicles
23		<u>at a</u>	ny time:
24		(1)	from 5:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.,

1	(2)	while going to or from or in connection with any
2		farm job, employment, or other farm-related work,
3	(3)	while going to or from authorized school
4		activities,
5	(4)	while going directly to or from any religious
6		worship service held by a religious organization,
7		or
8	(5)	while the licensee is operating a passenger car
9		at any time while accompanied by an adult who is
10		the holder of a valid commercial driver license,
11		Class A, B, or C driver license, and who is
12		actually occupying a seat beside the driver.
13	After such six-mo	nth period, if the licensee has complied with the
14	provisions of thi	s subsection, such farm permit shall entitle the
15	licensee to opera	te the appropriate motor vehicles at any time
16	without the restr	ictions required by this subsection.
17	<u>3. A farm pe</u>	rmit shall be issued only if:
18	<u>a.</u> the	applicant can prove that such applicant resides or
19	wor	ks on a farm by submitting the signed affidavit of
20	eit	her a parent or guardian stating that the applicant
21	liv	es on a farm,
22	<u>b.</u> <u>the</u>	applicant has successfully completed the
23	exa	mination requirements in Section 6-110 of this
24	tit	le, and

1	<u>C.</u>	if the applicant does not live on a farm but works on
2		a farm, the applicant submits the signed affidavit of
3		the applicant's employer and parent or guardian
4		attesting to such employment.
5	4. Any l	icensee issued a farm permit under this subsection:
6	<u>a.</u>	who is less than sixteen (16) years of age shall not
7		operate any motor vehicle with nonsibling minor
8		passengers,
9	<u>b.</u>	who is at least sixteen (16) years of age, for a
10		period of six (6) months after reaching sixteen (16)
11		years of age, shall not operate any motor vehicle with
12		more than one passenger who is less than eighteen (18)
13		years of age and who is not a member of the licensee's
14		immediate family, or
15	<u>C.</u>	who is at least fourteen (14) years of age, but less
16		than sixteen (16) years of age, shall not operate any
17		motor vehicle on interstate or turnpike highway
18		systems, nor shall a licensee operate a motor vehicle
19		within the limits of a city with a population in
20		excess of one hundred thousand (100,000) persons
21		according to the latest Federal Decennial Census.
22	Any convictio	n for violating this paragraph shall be construed as a
23	moving traffi	c violation. Service Oklahoma may, in its discretion,
24	suspend the p	ermit of an individual for violation of this paragraph.

1	5. Any licensee issued a farm permit under this subsection
2	shall not operate a wireless communication device while driving a
3	motor vehicle, except that a licensee may operate a wireless
4	communication device while driving a motor vehicle to report illegal
5	activity or to summon medical or other emergency help.
6	6. As used in this subsection, "farm" means any parcel of land
7	larger than one hundred sixty (160) acres which is used in
8	agricultural operations.
9	7. a. A farm permit issued under this subsection is subject
10	to suspension or revocation in the same manner as any
11	other driver license.
12	b. A farm permit may be suspended in accordance with
13	Section 6-113 of this title for any violation of
14	restrictions under this subsection.
15	c. Service Oklahoma shall suspend the farm permit upon
16	receiving satisfactory evidence that the licensee has
17	been involved in two or more accidents chargeable to
18	the licensee and such suspended license shall not be
19	reinstated for one (1) year.
20	8. Any licensee issued a farm permit under this subsection
21	shall provide, prior to reaching sixteen (16) years of age, a signed
22	affidavit of either a parent or guardian stating that the applicant
23	has completed at least fifty (50) hours of adult-supervised driving
24	with at least ten (10) of those hours being at night. The adult

13		driver license which is not restricted, in accordance
14		with the provisions of subparagraph a of paragraph 2
15		of this subsection, until the person reaches seventeen
16		(17) years of age,
17	b.	is at least sixteen (16) years of age but less than
18		seventeen (17) years of age and is convicted of two or
19		more moving traffic violations committed on separate
20		occasions shall not be eligible to receive a driver
21		license which is not restricted, in accordance with
22		the provisions of subparagraph b of paragraph 2 of
23		this subsection, until the person reaches eighteen
24		(18) years of age, or

1 fails to provide the affidavit required under с. 2 paragraph 8 of this subsection shall not be eligible to receive a driver license which is not restricted, 3 4 in accordance with the provisions of subparagraph a of 5 paragraph 2 of this subsection, until the person provides such affidavit to the division or the person 6 7 reaches seventeen (17) years of age, whichever occurs 8 first. 9 J.
