8	A Resolution recognizing September as Hydrocephalus
9	Awareness Month; supporting and bringing awareness, education, advocacy, and research to hydrocephalus.
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12	WHEREAS, Hydrocephalus is the buildup of fluid in the cavities
13	deep within the brain that is a life-threatening condition which
14	affects more than 1 million Americans. In the United States, 1 in
15	every 770 babies develops hydrocephalus. Hydrocephalus that is
16	present at birth is referred to as congenital hydrocephalus; and
17	WHEREAS, hydrocephalus that develops later in life in some
18	children, and even in adults, but is caused by a condition that
19	existed at birth, is still considered a form of congenital
20	hydrocephalus; and
21	WHEREAS, our current and former military servicemembers
22	suffering from moderate to severe traumatic brain injuries are at
23	risk of developing hydrocephalus; and
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WHEREAS, an estimated 800,000 older Americans believed to have Normal Pressure Hydrocephalus are often misdiagnosed as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's or dementia; and

WHEREAS, organizations, such as the Pediatric Hydrocephalus
Foundation and the Hydrocephalus Association, serve as global
leaders for hydrocephalus awareness, education, support, advocacy,
and research funding; and

WHEREAS, the Hydrocephalus Association, in 2009, established the month of September as Hydrocephalus Awareness Month.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives supports the recognition of the month of September as Hydrocephalus Awareness

Month in honor of Tucker Giles, a toddler from House District 18 who was diagnosed with congenital hydrocephalus; encourages the citizens of Oklahoma to observe the month of September as Hydrocephalus

Awareness Month; and supports the education, advocacy, and research for Hydrocephalus.

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
