**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB1759 establishes a procedure to allow the owner of a vehicle to submit a written notice to Service Oklahoma to transfer ownership of the vehicle to a designated person upon death.

The measure also defines *inheritance*, as it relates to the issuance of a certificate of title by inheritance, to mean any transfer from a deceased individual to the direct successor in interest of the decedent without consideration, whether through probate, administration, inter-vivos trust, transfer-on-death designation, or joint ownership.

Additionally, numerous references to the Oklahoma Tax Commission is replaced with Service Oklahoma to reflect changes in the state agency responsible for motor vehicle services.

**Fiscal Analysis**

In its current form, HB1759 defines "inheritance" and adds new law proposing that titles not subject to any lien be transferred in a transfer-on-death form. The subcommittee recommendation of this bill does not constitute a change in its fiscal impact. This measure is not expected to impact state revenues or state appropriations.
