**Research Analysis**

HB 1839 establishes Service Oklahoma as a separate and distinct agency by removing it from OMES. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services and Service Oklahoma may enter into an agreement for the transfer of personnel from the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to Service Oklahoma. No employee shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma except on the freely given written consent of the employee. All employees who are transferred to Service Oklahoma shall not be required to accept a lesser grade or salary than presently received. All employees shall retain leave, sick, and annual time earned, and any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during their tenure with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The transfer of personnel between the state agencies shall be coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
