**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2178 allows holders of a small farm winery or winemaker license to serve and sell wine at public events for on-premises and off-premises consumption. The licensee will only serve wine in their serving area, and multiple winemakers may combine their booths if necessary. The event originator or property manager may not require the seller to obtain any additional license or permit. The measure extends the license to include small brewers.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB2178, in its current form allows holders of a small farm winery or winemaker license to serve and sell wine at public events for on-premises and off-premises consumption. This measure does not mandate any action to any appropriated state agency, and is not expected to directly impact state revenues or state appropriations.
