Research Analysis

In addition to the provisions below, the Senate amendment to HB 2185 modifies an existing section of law, Title 2, 3-85, by adding the written concentrations to the numeric value of active ingredients allowed in the Combined Pesticide Law, but changing no concentrations. The amendment also allows for borate-based termite pesticide to be used as a stand-alone termite treatment, as long as the product is registered with the Environmental Protection Agency and the State Board of Agriculture.

HB 2185 clarifies the eligibility requirements for an aerial pesticide applicator license so aerial application of pesticides are allowed in situations other than an agricultural setting.
